

SEVERE WINTER IS FORECAST BY METEOROLOGIST

Washington, Nov. 12.—(A. P.) A severe winter for the United States with heavy snowfall and long continuing cold waves, broken by warm periods of brief duration, is predicted by Herbert J. Brown, widely known ocean meteorologist.

An abnormal condition, he holds, is pointed to by many factors, including the record breaking cold in many sections of the country this fall, beginning with the first snow in the northwest on September 18, four days before the official close of summer. The winter, he believes, will be followed by a late spring.

Primarily the predictions are based upon a study of ocean surface temperatures as determined by the amount of sun's heat reaching the earth. This solar radiation for more than three years, has been below normal. The present weather situation, he says, indicates that the world is facing a condition which will interfere seriously with crops, the cold fall and winter prospect being but forerunners of the next two years. A serious situation developing in the southern hemisphere in the crop year of 1926 to 1927 and in the northern hemisphere in 1927 is predicted.

Washington, Nov. 12.—(A. P.)—The resolution adopted by the Anti-Saloon League at its Chicago convention challenging the "legality and patriotism" of the Association Against the Prohibition Amendment, brought a rejoinder today from Chauncey Hackett, general counsel of the association.

"How long has it been illegal in this country to advocate a change in the constitution?" he asked in a statement. "Were the Anti-Saloon Leagues illegal and unpatriotic during the years they were trying to put prohibition into the federal constitution?"
