Independence, Or., Nov. 12.—An all day meeting to which a general invitation is extended to women particularly in Polk county, and which will be featured largely by speeches on the prohibition movement, has been announced here for Saturday, Nov. 14. The meeting is being staged under the auspices of the children's farm home authorities, who operate under the jurisdiction of the Oregon state Women's Christian Temperance union.

At Saturday's meeting Mrs. G. L. Buland will talk on the subject, "Temperance in Schools." Congressman Watkins will tell of the need of prohibition work and how to keep what we have. It has been announced that he will tell some of the "inside workings" of congressional legislation as he has come in contact with it.

The state children's farm home will come up for discussion, "Daddy Webb," of the home will be present with some of the children and the children will give several songs. Mrs. Miller, superintendent of the school, will tell of school conditions.
