

COAST PRICES ON SUGAR LOWER THAN IN EAST

Portland, Ore., Nov. 14.—(A.P.) Local sugar authorities are now firmly convinced that the market has been in slow level for the season at least for several months. Their line of opinion is based largely on the differential now existing between the New York and coast markets.

Today refined sugar in New York is up to 20 cents above the coast. The eastern market is quoted at \$4.40. The refined market at San Francisco is \$5.50 today, although it may advance over the week end. This is the first time in the history of the sugar business in the west that the coast price has been below the east, according to local dealers.

In fact, they assert the coast market is usually 40 cents above the New York market.

An advance of 20 cents a sack was announced by the San Francisco sugar refiners late today to become effective Tuesday morning. Local wholesale dealers will follow the advance bringing the best case grade sugar up to \$5.95 per sack Portland.

The poultry market cleaned up in good shape at the close of the week with prices strong and fractionally higher. Local dealers look for a steady increase in value from now up to Thanksgiving eve. Turkeys are especially firm with fancy dressed birds selling at 41 to 42 cents wholesale and live birds at 32 to 33 cents.

There is no change in butter and egg bids during the closing season of the exchange and both commodities are steady.

There was no change in the country dressed meat situation today and the market closed generally steady. Hogs are paying as high as 15 1/2 cents for choice, veal and 16 1/2 cents for choice light hogs.
