

PIERCE TO NAME SUCCESSOR TO JOE HELGERSON

Dallas, Or., Nov. 18.—The resignation of District Attorney J. N. Helgerson to accept an appointment as Assistant United States attorney under George Neuner makes necessary the appointment by Governor Pierce of a district attorney for Polk county to serve until January, 1927. Mr. Helgerson's resignation becomes effective January 1, 1926.

The change comes as a surprise to everyone and time has not elapsed for a full crop of aspirants for the office to spring up. There are at least four Polk county attorneys who have been mentioned as possible successors to Mr. Helgerson.

These are: Sibley of Dallas, C. R. Ellis of Independence, W. W. Harcombe of Dallas and E. K. Piaschek of Dallas. Mr. Sibley filled the office several years ago. He was among those considered for appointment as circuit judge to succeed Harry H. Belt last winter. He is a democrat.

Mr. Harcombe was democratic condition for district attorney at the 1924 election and made a good race. He is a member of the law firm of Brown & Harcombe and president of the Dallas chamber of commerce.

Mr. Piaschek served one term as district attorney previous to the first term of Mr. Helgerson. It is probable that he does not greatly desire the office. He is also a democrat.

Mr. Ellis, former law partner of D. E. Fletcher, ex-state representative, is a republican. It is understood that he is prepared to make a strong bid for the appointment. It is probable that he would have to Dallas if he secures the position.

In any event, the office will be filled at the 1926 election and whoever is appointed will have to defend it both at the May primary and the general election. This will make two county offices to be filled in 1926, the other being county commissioner with the term of William Hiddell Jr., expiring.

There will also be an election of circuit judge for Yamhill and Polk counties. Mr. Helgerson is completing his fifth year as district attorney of Polk county. He was elected in 1920 and again in 1924 and would have three more years to serve if

he had not voluntarily given up the office. He is also president of the state district attorney's association and secretary-treasurer of the 12th judicial district bar association. He is a second lieutenant in company L. O. N. G., and was former first sergeant with company L. overseas. He plans to resign his commission as an officer in both the bar association and district attorneys' association.

SILVERTON STORE HELD BANKRUPT BY CREDITORS

Portland, Or., Nov. 18.—Mitchell, Lewis & Staver company, M. Selley & company and Acme White Lead & Color works joined yesterday in filing a petition in the federal district court asking that Sappers Incorporated, of Silverton, be declared bankrupt. A schedule of liabilities and assets filed at the same time by W. L. Blessing, secretary of the company, placed the liabilities at \$22,924.74 and assets at \$19,377.47.

ESPEE TO START WORK ON EUGENE TERMINAL SOON

Eugene, Or., Nov. 18.—Work on the proposed terminal of the Southern Pacific Railway company here will be started at once and will be rushed, according to E. L. King, superintendent, who was here today.

Work of clearing the 220-acre tract northwest of Eugene will start Monday, under direction of Kelly & Sullivan, contractors. All funds for the work, amounting to \$507,000, have been authorized and are now available.

The first unit will include a series of four storage tracks, each with a capacity of 100 cars. The contracts for a ten-stall roundhouse will be let shortly. The largest erecting plant on the coast will be constructed.

Other work will also be rushed to completion, as the favorable fall weather has expedited work on the Natron cutoff and first trains will

be run over the shortened Eugene-Klamath Falls line on July 1, it is said.

MATCH IGNITES GAS; CAR BADLY DAMAGED
