

GRANGE DENIES CHARGES HE IS PROFESSIONAL

Chicago, Nov. 20.—A harassed "Red" Grange led his Illinois football team into Columbus today to meet Ohio State in his last appearance on a collegiate gridiron.

At his heels followed the hubbub of charges, denials, and speculation regarding his future that has brought thousands of words into print and insomnia to his admirers.

Grange's latest reply to stories that had him playing professional football, like the movies or selling his name as advertising, was vehement. "They have nothing on me. I have not received a penny. I am getting sick and tired of those constant rumors about my signing contracts to do this and the other. His word was accepted by those who could make him ineligible for the game, from President Kinley of the University of Illinois to Major John L. Griffin, athletic commissioner of the "big ten."

OREGON PRUNES BRING PREMIUM

Vancouver, Wash., Nov. 20.—(Special) — Washington-Oregon prunes, 40-55s, are selling for one-half cent more a pound f. o. b. New York, than Santa Clara California prunes, according to advices from brokers received by W. H. Wood, manager of the Washington Growers' Packing corporation. This is a reversal of conditions prevailing in 1923, when California prunes sold for 4 cents a pound more than Washington-Oregon prunes. Mr. Wood said. The low price of 1923 was due to panic among northern growers, who sold at lower prices than market conditions warranted.

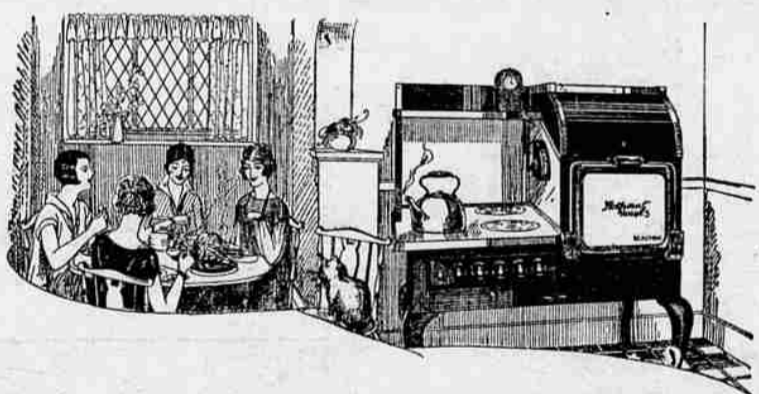
