ANGELS DEFEAT COLUMBIA 16-7 IN SNAPPY GAME

MT. Angel, Nov. 23.—Coach Joe Kashberger's fighting Angels triumphed over Columbia U., their old rivals on the M. A. C. gridiron yesterday afternoon in a bitterly fought game, to the tune of 16 to 7. The Mt. Angel team shown in every department of the game was never in real danger of being headed. In the first few minutes of play the Mt. Angel eleven carried the ball to the twenty yard line where Haynes booted it over for the first score of the game.

A beautiful 16-yard pass, Spears to Medlock netted them a touchdown later in the half. Medlock proved that he was a wonderful broken field runner in this play and several others during the game. The half ended 10 to 0.

Columbia kicked off in the second half and after a few plays the Angels punted. Columbia carried the ball to the middle of the field and then started an aerial attack which took the ball to the 35-yard line. Another pass coupled with penulties carried the ball to the Mt. Angel eight yard line. Gaus finally carried it over for the touch-down and Jackson kicked, Martin made consistent gains in taking the ball down the field, most of the Columbia gains being made thru center.

A 25-yard run by Spear gave Mt. Angel another touchdown. With the ball on the Columbia 35-yard line Spear, on a spinner play twisted and dodged his way up six tacklers and went for the touch-down. The kick failed.

Spears, Medlock and Haynes featured for the Angels. Johnson, end for Mt. Angel also played one of his best games, being in almost every play.

MENUS

- Fudge Cake**
1-3 cup butter
1 1/2 cups sugar
3 eggs
2 1/2 cups flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup cocoa
1 cup milk
1 1/2 cups chopped walnuts
1 teaspoon vanilla
- Mocha Cake**
5 eggs
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 cup powdered sugar
1 1/2 tablespoons Mocha extract (or strong coffee)

- 1 cup flour
This cake is delicious baked in layers at 400 degrees for 25 minutes and then spread with whipped cream, Mocha flavored or filled with cooked custard and topped with Mocha frosting.
- Apple Filling:**
2 apples
1 lemon
1 cup sugar
Pare and grate tart apples of good size. Add juice and grated rind of lemon and then the sugar. Cook 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Cool before spreading on cake.

- Jelly Filling**
1 glass jelly
1 egg white
Whip the jelly and then add the unbeaten egg white and with egg beater beat until stiff enough to hold shape.
- Plain Sugar Cookies**
1/2 cup butter
1 cup sugar
1 egg
2 1/2 cups flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 cup milk
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- Frozen Cookies**
2 cups melted fat
1 cup white sugar
1 cup brown sugar
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon cinnamon
4 cups flour

1 teaspoon soda
Brazil nuts, almonds
Mix ingredients in order given, sifting all dry ingredients together before adding. Mold in long rolls or pack in a deep pan like a bread pan, and roll in a clean cloth. Let stand in a cold place until hard, then slice very thin and bake at 350 degrees until brown (about 10 minutes).

Brownies
2 squares of chocolate
1/4 cup of fat
1 cup of white sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup of flour
1/2 cup of nuts
1 egg
Melt chocolate and add to the melted fat. Add sugar and egg and then the flour and the salt. Mix in the chopped nuts, pour in greased baking pans and bake at 350 degrees for about 10 minutes. They will look half baked, but mark off squares or strips when taken from oven and they will cool that way. Remove from pans when cold. These cookies have a fudge taste.

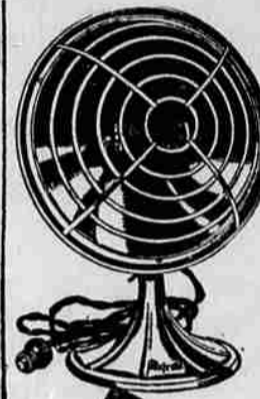

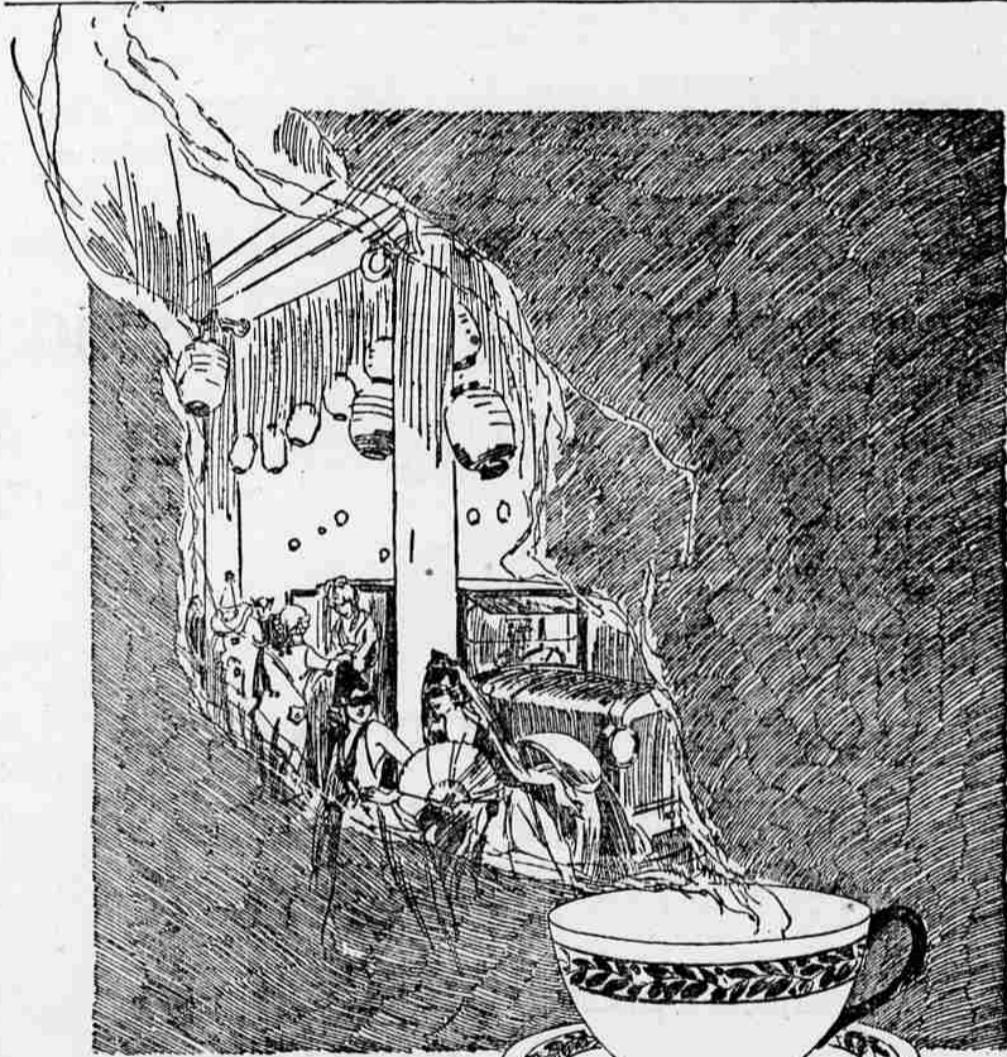
