

# 1924 FLAX CROP PROFITS AT PEN \$10,000 TOO LOW

In the same statement in which Governor Pierce yesterday announced formally the removal of Robert Crawford as superintendent of the state flax industry and the appointment of John Quinland in his place, the governor announced that profits from the 1924 crop will be about \$10,000 under estimates. The reason given for this is that the 350 tons of straw retted during the summer of 1925, mostly from the 1924 crop, was considerably damaged from over-retting. A considerable portion of it was too short to be used for other than tow purposes.

The large percentage that goes into the making of spinning tow will be worth from 10 to 20 cents a pound instead of from 10 to 33 cents that would come from the long fibre variety. "The plant now has on hand," says the governor's statement, "1400 tons of long straw which will be made into long fibre. At the present time careful experiments are being made in artificially drying the straw after retting. There is every indication that this plan will be a success, which means that the 1400 tons will be retted, artificially dried and scutched this winter. This will be about 250 tons of long fibre which is now worth from \$400 to \$660 a ton."

The resignation of Crawford and the appointment of Quinland was first announced by the governor about two weeks ago.

**Honey Ginger Nuts**  
1 cup strained honey  
1 cup sugar  
1 cup melted fat  
2 teaspoons baking powder  
1 egg  
1 tablespoon ginger  
1 cup chopped nuts  
1 1/2 cups flour

### MISCELLANEOUS RECIPES

**Glazing for Meats, Fish, Poultry**  
Boil 1 quart of consommé until it is reduced to 1 cup, or simmer a small amount of jellied stock with burnt sugar until it becomes like a syrup. Or add 1/2 teaspoon gelatine soaked in 4 tablespoons water to 1 cup of stock. The glaze should be melted over hot water and ap-

plied to the meat, fish or poultry.  
**Scalloped Celery With Cheese**  
2 cups celery, cut in small pieces and cooked  
2 tablespoons of butter  
2 tablespoons of flour  
1 cup of milk  
Little onion salt (if you like it)  
Dash pepper (white pepper is very good)  
2 tablespoons grated cheese  
Bread crumbs to cover dish before placing in oven  
Combine the cooked celery with the white sauce (made by combining and cooking the butter, flour and milk in regular manner) and turn into greased baking dish, sprinkle with bread crumbs and bake 20 minutes at 350 degrees F.

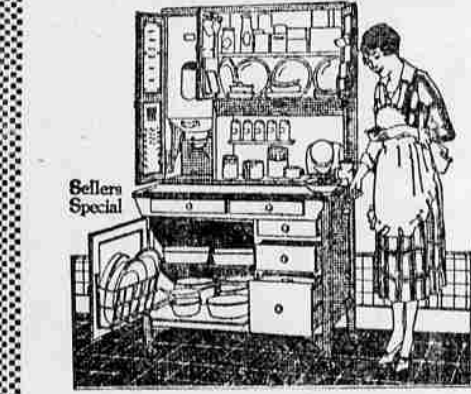

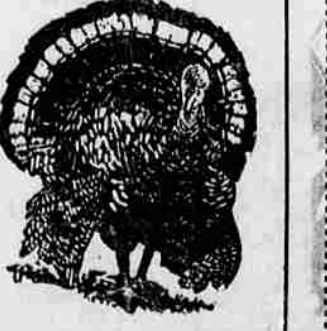
