

STATE HOLDS OFF ON EAGLE POINT PROJECT'S PLEA

Eagle Point irrigation district of Jackson county will have to wait a little longer before the state securities commission promises to extend the guarantee of interest on its \$400,000 bonds. The commission told representatives of the district yesterday that it would do so if the cooperation of the people of Jackson county can be obtained. An extension of 1 1/2 years in the guarantee is asked, increasing the present guarantee to five years. The commission received crop estimates from Jackson county projects showing that crop returns this year from the Medford irrigation district were \$2,500,000 and from the Talent district \$900,000. The former project was developed at a cost of \$10,000,000 and the latter at \$1,235,000.

It was declared that the Eagle Point district should make an even better showing considering the development cost.

PENATROPE TO BE EXHIBITED HERE

As the result of six years' research, the Penatropes, an electrical instrument that takes vibrations from the record through a magnet to pick-up, is announced by the Brunswick Phonograph company, a local display being scheduled by H. L. Stiff Furniture company on Friday and Saturday afternoons and evenings.

This new instrument resembles the phonograph in appearance and purpose. The name Penatropes, it is said, is derived from the Greek word meaning "all the octaves" and is fitting because its reproductions tone from 16 to 21,000 vibrations per second—a greater range than that of the most perfect organ made.

Minutest vibration of tone, of the singer or player, is turned into light waves, which are reproduced in wax through a photographic process. Hidden music is said to burst from old records when played on this instrument. The public is invited to attend the showing at the store.

DALLAS BUDGET ADOPTED

Dallas, Or., Nov. 25.—The budget of the city of Dallas was adopted Monday night by the budget committee and the levy authorized by the city council immediately following. No taxpayers were present to discuss the proposed levy. It calls for the raising of \$24,000 in 1926.

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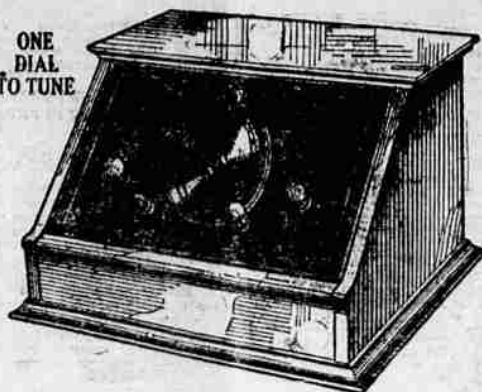
