

DIRECTORY OF BOOZE FORCES MAY BRING RAID

Chicago, Nov. 27.—(A. P.)—A little black book, containing a virtually complete directory of Chicago prohibition enforcement forces, found in a raid a week ago, may bring another extensive liquor investigation here.

The volume was found in a six-story building across from the criminal court after agents had discovered whiskey and alcohol valued at \$200,000 in the establishment of J. P. Scheure & Co. Its existence was carefully guarded until last night while enforcement officials endeavored to translate its code entries and check up on the information it contained.

Notations as to these prohibition agents regarded as "dangerous", those that could be "seen" and other data intimately personnel concerning the enforcement staff was contained in the book. It had comments on the habits of some of the agents, with the time generally left home in the morning and returned at night.

As a result of the book's entries, agents tested for honesty and skill with firearms, have been assigned to guard a large vault of the Scheure concern, which the raiders have been unable to open. At the time of the raid it was said that evidence had been obtained to show that liquor valued at more than \$1,000,000 a month had been passing through the Scheure plant.

ILLINOIS COACH DENIES REMARKS; ALL FOR GRANGE

Champaign, Ill., Nov. 27.—(A. P.)—Robert Zeupke, University of Illinois football coach, in a statement of his attitude on the entrance of Harold Grange into professional football, denied that he said that he did not want any more \$100,000 football players like Grange, in his address at the Illinois football banquet.

"I never said that I did not want any more \$100,000 football players like Grange," the statement says. "In a jocular manner I said that if I ever had any more players who made \$100,000 runs I would like to get in on it. This was a joke, of course. Whatever I said to Grange was to give him wholesome advice. I have only the sincerest wishes for his success and happiness."

KU KLUX MARRIAGE PERFORMED IN ROBES

Reno, Nev., Nov. 26.—(A. P.)—Guarded by solemn ranks of white-robed and masked members of the Ku Klux Klan, a young couple were married last night during a Klan ceremonial at the Coney Island social club.

The couple were masked and their names were not revealed by

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those present nor were they told by the minister following the ceremony.

With the lights of the flaming cross flickering across the hall floor, the red insignia of rank and the peak-hooded, white-robed phalanx, drawn up in ceremonial order the service resembled a tableau of some ancient rite.

This is believed to be the first Klan wedding in the west.

CANADIANS PICK SALEM FOR HOME

During the past year there has been a heavy migration of Canadians into Salem, according to local bankers, scores of them being driven out of the northern districts and away from heavy wheat farm holdings by the intensely cold weather, lured here by the mild winters and the springlike summers.

The important feature of the migration is the fact that most of these Canadians are men of means who have disposed of their holdings in the far north for considerable sums of money which they are reinvesting in the Salem district, principally in farm properties.

One Canadian, who came down here a few years ago and invested in a farm, sold it at a profit and invested in another farm which he sold at a profit, returned to his land in the north. This year he had a bumper crop, and sold out, crop farm and everything. He has just written to a local banker he will be down here in a few weeks to get back into the farming game in this section permanently.

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BOY SCOUTS OF MONMOUTH ARE GIVEN CHARTER

Monmouth, Ore., Nov. 27.—The Boy Scouts of Monmouth have been granted a national charter.

A scout troop has been organized here for several years but has been more or less inactive so had been unable to secure this charter. The organization this year has been very active the management being taken up in a very business like manner under the supervision of the Monmouth Commercial club, an executive committee being appointed consisting of Slay Taylor, City Marshall; Dr. Schutte of the Oregon Normal school; Mr. Roth, principal of the high school; F. B. Chambers, cashier of the First National Bank of Monmouth; and S. C. Halladay. A ten year lease on a tract of ground adjoining Hel-

rick park has been granted by the county court to the troop on which the boys plan to erect a 24x40 foot cabin of hewn logs to be secured from nearby land. In the near future a court of honor open to the public will be held at which badges of honor will be awarded and the Scout work will be presented. The boys have been busy putting in wood and doing odd jobs this fall in their spare time earning money with which they have opened an account in the local bank. Recently the scouts were hosts at a Father and Son banquet at which the fathers and the Commercial club were invited. The officers of the Monmouth patrol are Earl Stewart, Senior Patrol Leader; Fred Call, Patrol Leader; and Chas. Stewart, Scout Leader.

Much community interest is taken in this work and it is that by inducing boys to take the scout work juvenile crime will be lessened and the boys themselves greatly benefited.
