

SEX NOT TO SAVE MA FERGUSON IS SOLO'S CLAIM

Austin, Texas, Nov. 27.—The fact that the governor of Texas is a woman would not cause the state legislature to hesitate impeachment proceedings, if evidence is sufficient, Lee Satterwhite, speaker of the house, said today. He was discussing the agitation for a special session of the general assembly which the governor has been requested to call and which, if she fails to issue the call, the speaker has been asked to summon.

Mr. Satterwhite's reference to Governor Miriam A. Ferguson in connection with suggestion of impeachment is the first time her name has been used by a state officer. Heretofore when the purpose of the proposed special session was mentioned as for impeachment any state officer holding a major or minor position was mentioned and no one in particular.

"If the evidence is sufficient to bring impeachment, the fact that the governor of Texas is a woman would not cause the state legislature to hesitate in performing its duty," the speaker asserted.

Mr. Satterwhite added that in his opinion James E. Ferguson, former governor of Texas, impeached in his second term of office, is in reality the governor of Texas and believes that when Governor Miriam Ferguson dies it really her husband's action.

All state officials and heads of state departments and institutions are subject to impeachment in Texas under statutory provisions.

VAUDEVILLE AT HEILIG SCORES WITH AUDIENCE

Playing again to a house packed to the farthest corner of the balcony, last night's Association Vaudeville at the Heilig theatre won round after round of applause as act after act was presented.

Cambridge, Mass., Nov. 28.—(AP)—The photographic sky patrol maintained at the Harvard observatory has caught a "speedster" among comets, according to Professor Edward S. King of the observatory staff. Professor King characterized the year 1925 as a remarkable one for comets because of the discovery of five new comets in addition to half a dozen periodic ones scheduled to reappear.

"Two new comets have been discovered in the past week," said Professor King, "and one of
