

### SALEM TO MISS DRAGER IN GAME WITH MEDFORD

Salem's chances to defeat the Medford high school eleven next Saturday when the red and black team meets them at Medford in a post season game are somewhat dimmed since Joan Drager, tackle and star punter, has been forced from the game for awhile. Drager has had water on both knees which has troubled him all season but was so badly hurt in the game with the Franklin High school team on Thanksgiving day that he was forced out of the game shortly after the second half started. With Drager out of the lineup the locals would be lucky to get a win as Drager has been relied upon to keep the enemy out of the Salem territory. Drager will also be forced out of his old position at center on the basketball team, it is thought.

Temple was shifted to do the punting after Drager was taken out and he proved to be lucky to get the kicks off without them being blocked. Drager is definitely out of the game but is hoping to play when the whistle blows for the final game of the season next Saturday. He is hobbling around on a cane.

Medford is confident of taking the Salem team into camp as they have a fast, shifty team this year and have won over all of their opponents by large scores. They won the southern Oregon championship Thanksgiving day when they defeated Ashland by a score of 51 to 7. A former game between the two schools ended 68 to 0 for the Medford team. Medford wired that they expected to beat Salem by forward passes and trick plays. Their team is said to be small but was and with a dry field would probably expect to put it all over Salem. They have two husky giants in the backfield with which they hope to gain considerable yardage.

Salem's line has not been exceedingly strong all season but showed more weakness in the Franklin game than in any other game played in Salem during the season. Unless Salem can strengthen their defense in the line they will be apple pie for Medford. Salem must also fortify themselves against the Medford forward passes, but Salem has been alert on passes during the last few games. Medford is not expected to gain much yardage that way. The players will leave next Friday morning on the Southern Pacific at 11:25 o'clock and will return Monday morning.

### RESERVE BANK CASE UNDECIDED

Washington, Dec. 1.—(A. P.)—The Pasopoula case involving the validity of regulations requiring clearance of checks was sent back Monday by the supreme court to the court of appeals.

The order was based upon the technical ground that the appeal had been improperly brought by the bank from the federal district court to the supreme court. Instead of having gone to the court of appeals.

The supreme court did not go into the merits of the controversy which has been a hard fought issue in the banking world.

The Pasopoula, Miss. national bank, asserted that it had the right to make a charge for cashing checks drawn upon it by its depositors, even though the checks were sent through the federal reserve bank at Atlanta for collection. It asked the federal district court for northern Georgia to enjoin the reserve bank at Atlanta from continuing the practice complained of, but its application was refused.

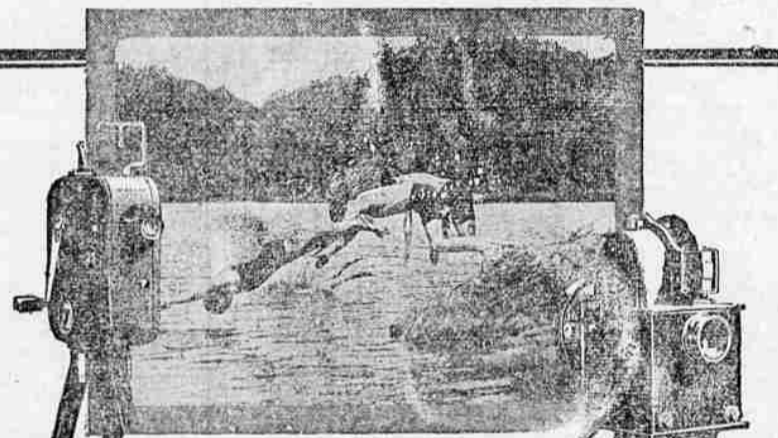
