

SOUTH DAKOTA PARTIES NAME FULL TICKETS

Pierre, S. D., Dec. 3.—(A. P.)—Primary candidates for congressional and state offices were named and platforms adopted by republicans, democrats and farmer-laborers of South Dakota in state conventions that continued until an early hour here yesterday.

Outstanding in importance was the endorsement for renomination of United States Senator Peter Norbeck and Governor Carl Gunderson by the republicans, who smoothed out early factional ruffles which threatened for a time to disrupt their convention.

The convention's endorsements are considered the equivalent of election, although candidates may file independently in any of the primaries which will be held in March. Heretofore the convention candidates always have been nominated.

Democrats endorsed C. J. Gunderson of Clay county, a cousin of Governor Gunderson for United States senator and W. J. Bulow of Beresford for governor, while the farmer-labor party named George Platt, a farmer of Marshall county, for senator and H. K. Warren of Yankton for governor.

For congress, the republicans endorsed the three incumbents, C. A. Christopherson, Sioux Falls; Royal C. Johnson, Aberdeen; and William Williamson, Custer.

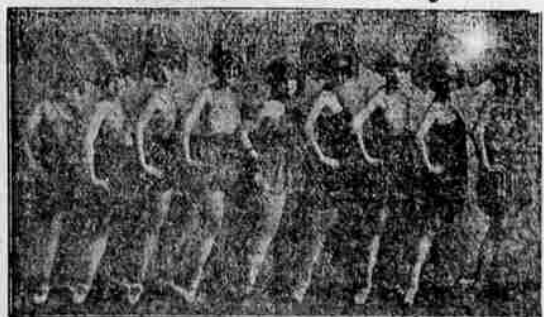

county, and John K. Kollock, intervenor-defendant. A demurrer to the alternative writ is sustained in an opinion by Justice Bean.

By vote of the owners of land in the district bonds were issued in November, 1915, and sold to the public. These bonds were refunded by vote of the district there was no statute granting authority for levying upon lands in

the district for the purpose of paying delinquencies in the payment of assessments upon other lands in the district. Such legislation was subsequently enacted.

Noble voted against organization of the district and issuance and refunding of the bonds. When he went to pay his taxes in 1924 he tendered to the sheriff

the full amount of his taxes less the 5 per cent levied to cover delinquencies. The sheriff refused to accept payment. Noble brought the original proceeding in mandamus to test the validity of the assessment. Kollock intervened as holder of one of the district bonds issued in 1922.

In the case of the state on relation of school district No. 56 of

Columbia county against B. F. Kleckner and others, appellants, appealed from Columbia county and up on petition for rehearing, the court, in an opinion by Justice Belt, reversed the lower court and remanded the case. In a previous opinion the supreme court dismissed the case.
