**PRESIDENT CONSIDERS DANA'S AND HALL'S NAMES**

Washington, Dec. 7.—(A.P.)—Responding to a request by President Coolidge that he present the name of a democrat and a republican for the place, Senator McNary republican, Oregon, today endorsed Frank L. Shull, republican, and Marshall N. Dana, democrat, as satisfactory candidates for membership of the shipping board of the Northern Pacific coast.

The man selected will take the place of Commissioner Haney, an Oregon democrat, who is serving under a recess appointment. Because a disagreement over board policies the president some time ago asked Mr. Haney to retire, but he declined to step aside until a successor should have been confirmed by the senate.
