

COAST GUARD UNDER PAY OF RUM RUNNERS

New York, Dec. 7.—(A. P.)—United States Attorney Buckner is anxious to learn the inland distribution system of the huge rum smuggling syndicate he believed has been smashed with the arrest of 21 men Thursday.

The arrest of William Dwyer, widely known sportsman and race track owner, and 20 other men, Mr. Buckner feels has disposed of the Atlantic seaboard operations of the alleged ring, but today he turned his attention to the disposal of liquor after it was landed.

A complete confession from one of the six coast guardsmen arrested in the roundup which began Thursday involves prohibition agents and New York policemen.

Mr. Buckner has indicated that the confession is to be read to the grand jury Monday, with the expectation that more indictments and arrests will follow. Forty three indictments have been issued already and 21 of them served.

In addition to giving passive protection to rum smugglers, some United States coast guardsmen actually assisted in landing liquor in rough weather. Mr. Buckner declared. He said an unnamed patrol boat went out to a rum schooner and brought ashore 300 cases in one instance. The boatswain got \$1,000 and each member of the crew \$240 for this job, he added.

QUARANTINE OREGON PINE

Washington, Dec. 7.—(A. P.)—A hearing on the question of a pine quarantine against Oregon because of the appearance of the white pine blister rust in that state will be held in the offices of the federal horticultural board January 8.

It is proposed to prohibit the movement from Oregon into other states of all five leaved pines and currant and gooseberry plants, the latter being the intermediate host plant necessary in carrying the disease from one pine tree to another.

The blister rust has been discovered in Tillamook and Clatsop counties, Oregon, which brings the infection within 175 miles of the northern edge of the sugar pine forests of southern Oregon and northern California.

Well Executed Pass Gives Medford High Victory Over Salem

The Salem high school football team lost to the Medford high school, 14 to 13, Saturday afternoon at Medford, and thereby lost the logical claim to the Western Oregon interscholastic title. The game was fiercely fought with the winner in doubt until the final whistle. Salem outweighted the Medford eleven and it was speed against brawn, with speed winning out in the end.

The winning touchdown came in the last quarter. Lyons, Salem, fullback, fumbled the ball and Medford recovered on the 30-yard line. Medford bucked the ball for a first down and Dunn was substituted for Herriott at quarter. Dunn went through right tackle for a yard. On the next play, with eight yards to go, he threw a beautiful pass to Sinner behind the goal line for the final and winning touchdown. Conrad kicked the extra point.

60 Yard Run Vain
The Salem team kicked off to Dunn in the final quarter on the Medford 30-yard line. On the next play Moore raced 60 yards before he was downed. Salem held them for downs and the red and black eleven took the ball. In desperation the locals tried an aerial attack for short gains when a pass was thrown behind the goal line for the ball around right end for 12 yards. On the next play Senn made 30 yards, being forced out of bounds. With five minutes of play left, Medford started ripping the Salem left side of the line and when the final gun ended the game the ball was on the Salem eight yard line.

The crowd swept out and carried the Medford players from the field. Every member of the Salem team walked from the field weeping. One of the largest crowds to hear a football game this season stood in front of The Capital Journal to hear the results as they came in by quarters. Not one of the fans who heard the final results left with his head in the air.

Salem Ends Cried
The Salem eleven showed a powerful line from tackle to tackle but Medford found the ends weak after the first quarter. A Lyons and Neecke played the best game for the locals.

The Salem team won the toss and kicked off to the Medford 20-yard line, returning to the center of the field. After three attempts to buck center, Medford kicked to the center of the field. On the first play Neecke tore off five yards but

to 12 minutes instead of 15. Coach Callison held to the rules, however, and insisted on the regulation time. Salem kicked off in the second half and by off-tackle play and linebacks Medford carried the ball to the Salem 40-yard line. Medford made first down and kicked a field goal from the 30-yard line. Medford kicked off to Salem and Neecke and Kelly, with line bucks and Lyons jabbing the center, carried the ball to Medford's 10-yard line, when Morgan, Medford, was hurt and time called to allow his leg to be bandaged. Lyons, on four bucks through center carried the ball over Temple converted the extra point. The quarter ended with Salem leading 13 to 9 and the ball in the Salem possession on Medford's 20-yard line.

On the first play in the final quarter, Lyons in a tackle buck fumbled and Neff of Medford recovered. Medford made eight yards on off-tackle plays but was penalized five yards when Hughes moved the ball. Medford made first down. Medford first down and eleven yards to go. Dunn was substituted for Herriott at quarter. Then came the pass for the winning touchdown of the game.
