

OLD COMPANY M TO HOLD ANNUAL REUNION FRIDAY

The seventh annual reunion of the members of old company M, 162nd infantry, local unit of the United States army that served overseas during the World war, will be held Friday night, December 11. Notices have been sent out to all members of the company. Nearly 50 men, or a third of the regular war time strength of the unit, are expected to be present at the banquet.

Roy Neer, captain, now a resident of Portland, will come to Salem especially for the occasion, and will preside as toastmaster. A few short snappy talks will be allowed. Ferris "Fat" Abbott, one of the company's vocal experts, along with Earl "Heavy" Hendrick of Salem and a few others, will be on hand. Whether or not they will be permitted to sing "Everybody Works but Father," and a few of their old familiar dirges, has not yet been definitely decided, the reason given being that "if arrangements are made to have them sing, nobody will come to the banquet."

An invitation has been extended to Colonel Mat, sometimes more familiarly known as "the old man" to attend the reunion. Captain Staffin of company L will also have the honor of sitting with company M, which is, members of the local unit declare, the greatest honor that could be afforded any L company man. Chaplain Gilbert of the 162nd regiment, formerly a resident of Astoria but now living in Portland, has been invited to be here Friday and will probably be asked to speak.

Lieutenant Colonel Abrams of Salem will be on hand.

Decorations are under the supervision of a committee consisting of Breyman Boese and Guy Young, Archie Holt, now resident manager of the Heilig theater, but at one time the merest private in M company, will have charge of the entertainment. The moving picture film of company M taken at the time of the exhibition drill held on the court house lawn in the fall of 1917, shortly before the company left for Long Island, England and France, will be shown.

J. Fuhrer has been appointed mass sergeant for the occasion.

LEAGUE UNABLE TO AGREE UPON MILITARY AID

Geneva, Switzerland, Dec. 8.—(AP)—The disarmament council of the league of nations has failed to reach an agreement concerning the wisdom of having a study made of a plan to assure prompt military help to any nation which is the victim of aggression. Belgium and France had fought for this as a feature essential to the preparation of the proposal in-

ternational disarmament conference.

Subsequent to the adverse vote Belgium filed a strong reservation declaring a system of prompt assistance more effective than disarmament. The problem was referred to the main council of the league for settlement.

The Belgian reservation is virtually a warning that Belgium will find it difficult to participate in the disarmament conference unless some importance is attached to the subject which, in the Belgian view, is of first magnitude if the nations are to weaken their power of defense. France

packs the Belgium demand, but Great Britain and Sweden oppose it.

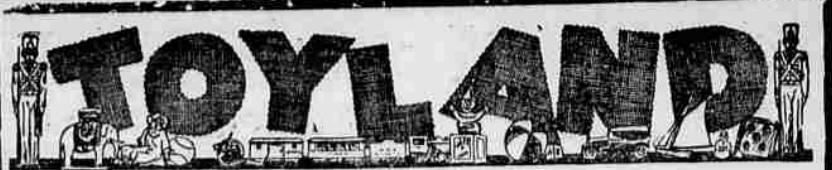

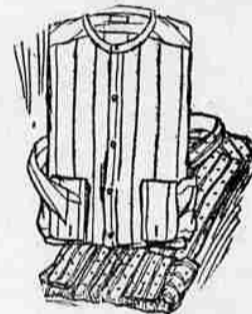
