

### NEW BUILDING FOR NOVEMBER OVER LAST YEAR

Building operations in Oregon for the month of November, this year, exceeded those of November, last year, the figures being \$3,597,017 and \$2,460,798, respectively, while the total for the previous month of October, this year, were \$2,715,835.

November isn't a heavy building month for Salem, and permits taken out in November, this year, were only \$79,550, an increase, however, over the same month for last year when the total for the month was \$31,200. Eugene's figures for last month were \$187,000 against \$58,150 for November, 1924. The November figures for 1924 and 1925 for other cities in the state are: Astoria, this year, \$29,750, last year, \$121,130; Klamath Falls, this year, \$109,430, last year \$45,173; LaGrande, this year \$12,340, last year \$12,680; Medford, this year, \$57,750, last year \$41,125; Portland this year \$3,121,195, last year, \$2,118,340.

### MUTTON DOUBLES IN PRICE HERE

Mutton has practically doubled in price in the last six months, according to bids opened by the state board of control yesterday for supplies at the state institutions for the next six months. The new quotation on mutton is 14 cents, while when bids were opened last June the quotation was \$7.20 a hundred.

Fresh beef has advanced from \$7.20 to \$9.55, while bacon has dropped a trifle, and is now 27 cents. The lowest bid on coffee of the kind used by the state is 29 1/2¢ as compared with 31 1/2¢ six months ago. Hard wheat flour is now \$7.64 and six months ago was \$7.42. Ham is 26 cents. Six months ago it was a fraction over 27.


