

TED BROWN TO WRESTLE REED ON DECEMBER 22



Ted Brown has been matched to meet Robin Reed, world's amateur champion in his first professional wrestling match to be staged in Salem, on December 22, according to Harry Plant, matchmaker.

Reed was winner in the Olympics during his amateur days and recently turned professional. Brown was secured for certain yesterday afternoon. The match will be for two hours or the best two out of three falls. Plant has not as yet decided who will referee.

Reed and Brown wrestled in Portland about three weeks ago and Brown has been turning every stone to get another match with the Corvallis boy. Reed is fast, shifty and has a wonderful array of holds. Reed and Brown in their match in Portland put on the fastest and best match yet seen in that city, according to Virgil Hamlin. Brown is no novice at the game and is training hard to be in the best of shape for the match, planning on getting revenge.

Albany and Eugene have taken up wrestling and have been drawing big houses, according to reports. The last match at Albany drew a \$1400 house and they are planning on a \$2500 house at the next card. FOREIGNERS GET SOUTH AMERICAN AIR CONCESSIONS

Washington, Dec. 12—(A.P.)—Foreign interests have secured exclusive concessions for air operation in South America, the Mitchell court-martial was told today by Major George V. Strong of the army general staff.

"In Central America," Major Strong testified, "there have been concessions granted, but they have not been exclusive."
In Columbia, he said, a concession was negotiated by German capitalists with the Colombian government. Guatemala had given a concession to a French concern but Major Strong said it was not an exclusive arrangement.

Representative Frank R. Reid chief counsel for Colonel Mitchell, told the court these concessions had been reported to the war department by Major Ray Croft Walsh of the army air service who held them to be a serious menace to the defense of the Panama canal. Major Strong said Major Walsh's

report had been used as the basis of a war department recommendation to the state department for the establishment of a United States air mail service in Central America, but that the negotiations between the two departments and with representatives of the post-office and commerce departments still are in progress.

The court then turned to Colonel Mitchell's charge that the national guard has been flying without parachutes for several years. Captain R. W. Mackie, of Houston, Texas, national guard air officer and commercial flier, testified for the prosecution that the air squadron of which he was a member, was supplied with parachutes a year ago and no pilot was allowed to take the air without a parachute. All the planes the squadron had, he said, could be operated by pilots wearing parachutes.
