

ELGIN DENTIST GIVEN FREEDOM BY HIGH COURT

E. O. Willson, a dentist of Elgin, Or., who was convicted in the lower court for Union county on a charge of manslaughter, in connection with an illegal operation on a young woman who was in a delicate condition due to her alleged relations with him, is given his liberty by an opinion of the supreme court today, reversing the verdict in Judge J. W. Knowles' court. The opinion was written by Justice Burnett.

Willson was sentenced by the lower court to serve two years in the penitentiary and pay a fine of \$500.

The opinion of the supreme court hinges on failure of proof that an embryo child was actually killed by the operation performed upon the woman by the dentist.

The supreme court, in an opinion by Justice Rand, affirmed Judge T. E. J. Duffy of the lower court for Deschutes county in the case of the state against Ace Dobson, who was convicted in the justice and circuit courts of selling intoxicating liquor. The main contention of the defendant was that the complaint charged that the defendant "did then and there sell intoxicating liquor."

Without there having been inserted before the word "sell" the word "unlawfully."

Judge Rand points out that in Oregon any sale of intoxicating liquor is unlawful, unless it is ethyl alcohol under certain conditions and the sale charged against Dobson did not come under this provision.

NEW BUILDINGS SECURE TENANTS

They have been forced from a part of their present quarters by the plan of the First National bank to building a 10-story building on ground partly occupied by their store. A fine new little restaurant is planned for the middle store in the Will building and it has not yet been given out what will occupy the other store.

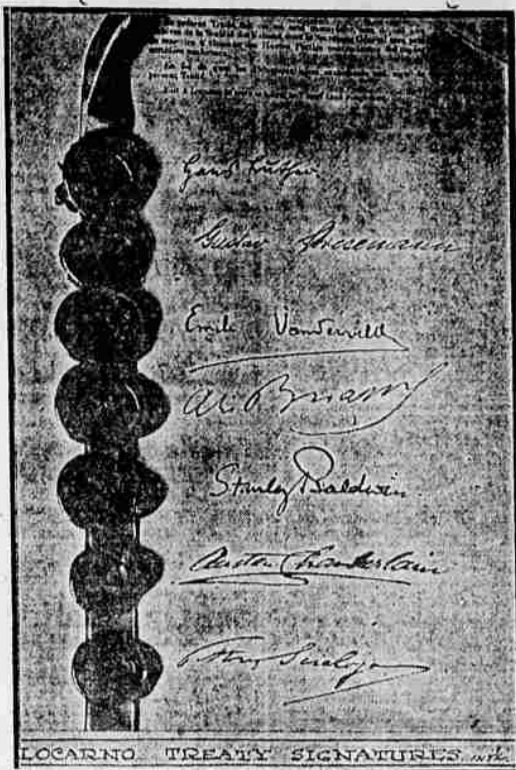

State of Oregon vs. George Glasburn, appellant; appeal from Washington county; appeal from conviction for violation of prohibition law. Opinion by Justice Bean. Judge George R. Bagley affirmed.

Albert Freeman vs. State Industrial accident commission, appellant; action to collect compensation. Opinion by Justice Brown. Judge W. M. Ramsey affirmed.

State of Oregon vs. R. Dobson, defendant and appellant; appeal from Deschutes county. Appeal from conviction for violation of prohibition law. Opinion by Justice Rand. Judge T. E. J. Duffy affirmed.

Wm. H. Taylor Finance Corporation, plaintiff and respondent, vs.

Oregon Logging and Timber company, defendant and respondent, A. G. Palmer, intervenor and respondent, Calvin H. Hill, intervenor and appellant, appeal from Multnomah county; petition for appointment of receiver. Opinion by Justice Rand. Judge George Bowman affirmed.
