SEEK TO ANNEX TWO ADDITIONS TO SALEM CITY

Sponsored by the residents of the district, petitions to the city council to institute proceedings which, if successful, will annex the Morningside and Nob Hill districts on the south to the city of Salem and bring approximately 1000 more people into the city proper, are being circulated today with the intention of securing election coincident with the regular state primary elections in May. The petitions are being circulated only in the city, being directed to the city council, but they are being backed by a large number of the residents in the sections seeking annexation. 305

Included in the proposed addition is about 320 acres, extending about half a mile south from, and about a mile east and west along the south boundary line of the city both sides of the Pacific highway. Technically the property is described as the S 1/2 of S34, Township 7S, R3W of the Willamette Meridian, including all of the property in that description except the City View cemetery, which is already inside the city limits. 305

Approximately 1500 names will be required to the petitions to get the proposal on the ballot at the proposed special election, when it would be voted on by both the residents of the effected district and the voters of Salem separately. 305

ENTIRE EAST AND SOUTH GETS A WHITE XMAS

Washington, Dec. 23.—(A.P.)—A bright Christmas with nearly normal temperatures is looked for by the weather bureau for most of the country. 305

A white Christmas over all northern sections except near the coasts, with a blanket of snow covering the interior between the Appalachians and the Pacific was predicted, together with seasonal temperatures, except for cold weather along the northern border and mild weather west of the Rockies. 305

FARMERS PLAN RELIEF MEASURE

Des Moines, Iowa, Dec. 23.—(A.P.)—The executive committee of the American Council of Agriculture and the Corn Belt committee of farm organizations will soon "agree upon a measure which will present the export corporation idea in the simplest form compatible with the necessities and will provide a stimulus to the great cooperative movement," a resolution adopted here yesterday by the committee states. 305

When terms for such a measure are agreed upon, the committee, which according to its chairman, William Hirth, editor of the Missouri Ruralist, represents more than a million mid-west farmers, will ask farm organizations of the country to join in asking for its passage by the 69th congress. 305

Until such time the committee expresses a wish that congress hold a further consideration of agricultural relief bills. 305

Show In Siskiyou

Medford, Ore., Dec. 23.—(A.P.)—Snow to the depth of eight inches fell Tuesday night on the Siskiyou mountain unit of the Pacific highway, and to the depth of six inches on the Green Springs mountain road between Ashland and Klamath Falls. Both roads are open to automobile traffic. 305

Paris, Dec. 23.—(A.P.)—The tempest continues to howl in France, leaving death and destruction in its trail. Nine passengers were drowned in the Seine last night about Rouen when a ferry boat capsized. All the victims were working men. The ferryman was the only person saved. 305

Paris now is almost completely cut off by telegraph from the outside world. One line only is working with Switzerland, Belgium and England. There is no com-
