

SCIENTISTS IN ANNUAL SESSION

Kansas City, Mo., Dec. 29.—(A.P.)—Widely varying topics, ranging from tornadoes and sun spots to a great pre-historic Kansas river, were discussed at the annual convention of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and related organizations here Monday.

Several thousand delegates of the association and twenty allied societies were registered. The convention will continue through Saturday.

Only the geology and geography sections held meetings today, with a general session of the organization scheduled for tonight.

The death toll of tornadoes will increase in the middle west, as it becomes more thickly settled. S. D. Flora, meteorologist of the United States weather bureau, Topeka, Kansas, forecast before the American Meteorological society. Such disasters as claimed 725 lives in southern Illinois a year ago will be repeated many times.

Mr. Flora said and unless construction of houses and public buildings is improved, few large cities will escape the devastation of wind storms.

The stability of modern steel and reinforced concrete buildings may never be known until a tornado strikes the business center of a great city, Mr. Flora continued.

ANDREWS VISITS ATLANTIC PORTS

Savannah, Ga., Dec. 29.—(A.P.)—Having completed inspection of customs ports of entry and coast guard and prohibition units on the south Atlantic seaboard, except Florida, Assistant Secretary of the Treasury Andrews and his party left today for Key West and Havana.

General Andrews is satisfied with conditions in the three agencies under his control, in North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia. He feels they are meeting the present situation and making plans for any further requirements upon them.

In each port where the treasury official has talked with his subordinates, he has assured them they should not hang back in asking for need of personnel and equipment.

Without proper support from Washington, he said, the good work they have done would be nullified.
