Hendricks of the Salem Statesman and Miss Lucy Case, nutrition specialist of the Oregon Agricultural college, who told of the uses and value of honey as a food.

H. M. Mead, president of the county association, presided. It is hoped as a result of the meeting to secure an increased membership in the association, take steps toward fighting bee diseases, and interest boys and girls of the county in the formation of bee clubs.

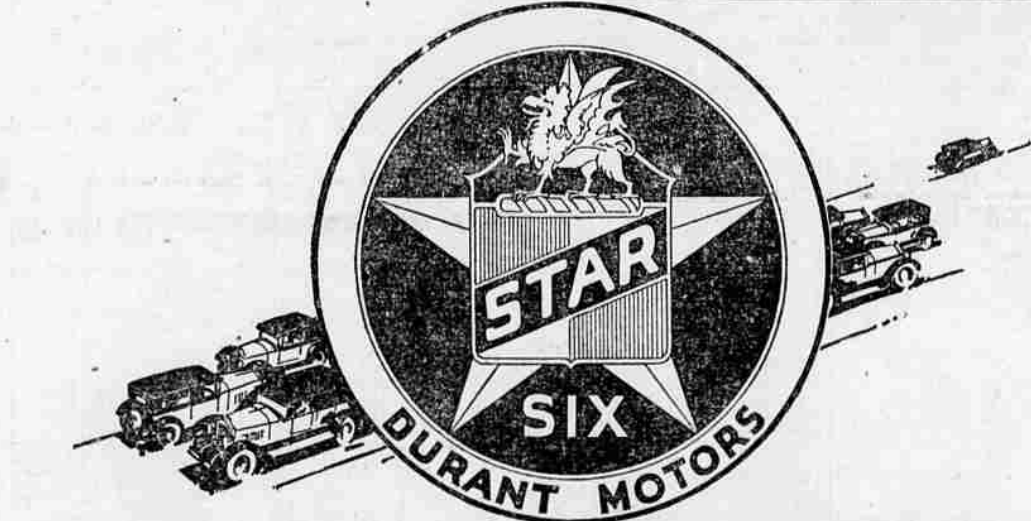
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
