

DEDICATE FINE ARTS BUILDING AT UNIVERSITY

University of Oregon, Eugene, Oct. 21.—(Special)—At the dedication of the Fine Arts building today as part of the Semi-Centennial celebration Dr. E. T. Williams, professor of Oriental languages and literature at the University of California and one of the leading American authorities on the Orient, declared that the proximity of the University of the Far East made it particularly fitting that a museum of Oriental art be established in Eugene.

"This building," said Dr. Williams, "will not only serve as a fitting memorial to President P. L. Campbell, who was so interested in art, but will also provide a suitable home for the Murray Warner collection.

"It is not strange that a museum of Oriental art should be established in this far Occident, but a very appropriate thing. We should learn to appreciate the art of the Orient in order to gain an understanding of these far-removed people; this understanding cannot but cause prejudice to vanish," he declared.

The art of the Orient is worthy of study, said Dr. Williams. "Civilization was born in Asia, and from Asia we derive our faith, the beginnings of science and our philosophy. In a university we seek the wisdom of all the lands and ages, and the Orient should not be neglected. May Oregon continue to gather here the rare treasures of the Far East to be an inspiration to her sons."

"Each race has its own inheritance of ideals and traditions. These find representation in art, and for that reason the art of every country is characteristically different. We do not want the Chinese or Japanese to adopt our ideas of art, neither do we want to adopt their ways, for we have our own national ideals to maintain. But to appreciate and understand the art of the Orient, is to increase the inter-racial friendship and peace."

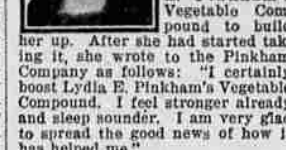
