

# HARD BATTLE IS AWARDED BENNY PELZ

Last night's thrilling battle between Benny Pelz and Phil Hayes, which waged for nine terrific rounds with one quiet, will go down in the pages of ring history for the coming generation to read and recall. Pelz's hand was raised by Referee Tom Loutitt in token of victory at the end of the tenth round with both fighters hardly able to stand alone.

So close was the decision that many were of the opinion that the fight should have been called a draw and bores from all over the armory greeted the verdict. However, without taking any credit from Hayes, who put up one of his best fights and returned a hard blow for hard blow, the decision was not termed an unfair, though a draw would have left a more pleasing taste in the mouths of the crowd who packed the auditorium.

**Pelz Carries Margin**

In going over the fight it will be seen that Benny earned a margin in the fourth, fifth, eighth and ninth, with Hayes taking the second and third. The other four rounds were won by Pelz, the fighters sending in plenty of telling blows.

In the first the fighters contented themselves with feeling each other out, looking for some kind of an opening. In the second Phil led to Pelz and again in the third he had a margin, both rounds going to Phil. Pelz believed that he was hit low in the last minute of the third, as he went to his knees and made wild gusts, cautioning Loutitt as the bell sounded.

Enraged, Pelz rushed at Hayes in the fourth and slammed his way to almost even terms again. In the fifth the former newsboy continued his rushing, slashing tactics and won that round, to make two rounds apiece.

**Hayes Flours Benny**

Both scrapers turned loose in the sixth and seventh with neither one having any marked advantage. In the eighth canto Benny tore into Hayes and had him nearly out at the end of the round. Resuming his leading tactics in the ninth Pelz continued to hammer Hayes, who although hanging on was returning many blows. The ninth went to Benny.

In the tenth Hayes, still groggy, staged a comeback that threatened to end the fight in a knockout. He floored Pelz with a hard right, and barely able to stand himself, fell on top of the Portlander.

Again in this last round Hayes sent a hard jolt, but Pelz earned a draw in this round.

Kid Googerside, 130, and Young Watts, 122, both of Salem, fought four rounds to a popular draw. Googerside had a slight edge if anything as his ability to hit with a right uppercut almost at will in the last two rounds took the steam out of Watt's sails.

**Special Event Uneven**

A special event in which Jimmy Fargo, lost by a knockout to Kid Ohregon, 110, of Portland, in the first round of a scheduled four-round go, left the fans unsatisfied. Ohregon was too good for Fargo and the matching of the two was a mistake.

Russell Green, 128, fought Billie Burdett, 128½, of Portland, to a draw. Green kept pecking away in the first two rounds, but Burdett came back strong in the last two.

Eddie Moore, 116, and Norman Snell, 116, of Portland, met in the semi-windup which went to Moore in the fifth round. Snell went to his knees and protested that Moore had struck low. Loutitt called him out. Snell was not hurt and was able to get right up and trot out of the ring.
