

### HAUGEN BILL FOR FARM AID IS PREPARED

Washington, Dec. 21.—(AP)—Companion for Senator McNary's farm relief bill was drafted Monday by Chairman Haugen, of the house agricultural committee, making it possible to once more attach the title "McNary-Haugen" to the proposed legislation.

The McNary bill, already has been introduced in the house by Representative Tolson, democrat, South Carolina, but he changed it so as to postpone for two years the application of an equalization fee on cotton. As it was written the measure would have authorized such a fee on basic crops, to be used to fund the surplus problem.

There had been talk of a disagreement between senate farm leaders and Mr. Haugen over the tariff as it related to agriculture relief, but the belief was expressed today by those leaders that it would be found to concentrate on one farm measure.

### DUCKS DEFEATED BY MONEY CHANGERS
