

New Color Creations in SPRING HATS

The most interesting news in men's hat styles this year is the striking "come-back" of the Derby! The college boys, who really are the ones who make or break styles, are enthusiastically adopting the Derby, and it therefore bids well to become popular throughout the country.

From a standpoint of appearance, the Derby always held its own, to a certain extent, looking well, and apparently being a necessary adjunct for dress occasions. But not until this season has the Derby begun to be worn in such large numbers. The "brown Derby" of comic paper fame also will demand attention, although not nearly as great as its darker brother.

Snap and Curved Brims
The felt hat of other years continues to be the leader, while sharing popularity with the Derby. Felt hats in Fedora shape, and single crease styles will be worn this year. The crowns are a trifle lower and noticeably smaller; white brims are either the snap variety or curved. Both the crown and brim edges will be seen.

In regard to colors, grays, tans and browns will predominate, with a sprinkling of the ever popular blue, as well. The variety of shades or "tones" of these colors will be amazingly great, featuring the pastel shades.

Hat Bands seem to have settled down into conservative ways, as there will not be enough colorful bands to be seen to amount to anything.

This Year's Straw Hats
This year the straw hat will make itself "felt" more strongly than ever, so great is the variety from which the particular man may make a selection. Light-weight straw hats will, of course, hold first place, the conventional sailor easily leading the field.

Straw sailors will be decorated with gayly colored bands, while the straw itself will favor white, light brown and tan shades.

The "outmeal straw" hats will be the big novelty this year. This is a rough weave hat having an "outmeal" appearance, and coming in a variety of shapes, and several shades.

The variety of brims on straw hats will not be great, as the size seems to be pretty much standardized, being just about the same as last year, possibly a trifle narrower.

Panamas and Leghorns
A certain percentage of men will favor the "old reliable" Panama and Leghorn hats as most suitable to their taste. Panamas will be in the customary styles, Fedoras, optima and semi-telegraph, in the conventional Panama tones. Leghorn straws will be in several color effects, ranging from white to light brown.

The time honored cap will continue to hold its popularity, although there is nothing startlingly new in cap styles. The one and eight-piece models are still good, and visors are a trifle wider. Bathy-tub patterns may be expected this season—all being especially suitable for sports and out-door wear rather than for daily use.

HIGH HATS ALONG NEW LINES NEXT FOR MEN, CLAIM

London, Mar. 21.—(AP)—Piccadilly strollers whose silk hats are not slightly belled at the top and do not measure exactly 5 1/4 inches in height cannot make any impression on London's fashion dictators. Also their hats must have a brim exactly 1 1/2 inches wide.

Bank clerks, music hall managers, undertakers and doctors have never abandoned the high hat in London. Bookmakers also have clung to them through thick and thin. And diplomats were faithful to their uniform even during the Zeppelin raids. But the war put the average man into lounge clothing and he has refused to abandon soft hats and bowlers in favor of high hats and long coats. The hatmakers, however, say the high hat is coming back. More have been sold in the last year in Great Britain than in any other year since the beginning of the great war, and the fashion shops are plugging so hard on the latest shapes that it is pretty hard for gentlemen to get by with silk hats of ancient vintage. A straight stovepipe instantly puts them into the class with bank messengers.
