Presidents, royalty, leading figures in the world's activities and most of the interesting places of the world have a personal interest for C. Baxter Peyton, now in Salem on business connected with the Groller society.

Peyton's valuable album collection of photographs and autographs of dignitaries reads like an edition of "Who's Who", including such European and American characters as the King of Belgium, Roumanian Queen, Crown Prince of Sweden, Crown Princess Louise, Admiral Beatty, Marshal Foch, General
