

M'CONKIE WILL CONTINUE TEST AT HUNT PLANT

With from 75 to 100 tests completed on the strawberry pack, the American Can company, through its research representative J. F. McConkie, who is working on canning problems at the Hunt brothers plant, will tackle cherries and loganberries for canning experiments as they are now coming on.

The experiments are principally to ascertain whether canneries may commercially put up packs, particularly of strawberries, cherries and loganberries which will hold in the cans in good shape without pinholing for two years. In the present commercial can on these three varieties of fruits especially, a percentage of pinholing sufficient to be serious very often shows up within a year after packing. This causes much loss, especially in years when the pack does not move immediately into consumption and there is anything like a heavy carryover.

The experiments being conducted by Mr. Conkie and W. O. Allen, district manager for Hunt brothers, are along two general lines. One is to get a can so prepared that it can be manufactured cheap enough and yet carry the fruit for two years. Another is along the line of attempting to reach the same results with the present can but through experiments in the canning itself, such as by varying the degrees of heat or applying new methods to canning. The tests which have been made have been along both lines, with various kinds of metals used in the

can, and also through varying processes. The result of the tests, of course, is dependent on the character, and how successful they have been will depend on what condition the cans are in after the two year period has elapsed. As a matter of fact a year and six months should tell the story as in the last six months the cooler temperatures come on which aid in keeping the fruit in condition in the cans.

No tests have been made with gooseberries as it has been pretty well determined that the pinholing of gooseberry cans is due to the use of sulphur sprays. Peas, peaches, apples and similar cut fruits do not pinhole and no particular experiments will be made with them.

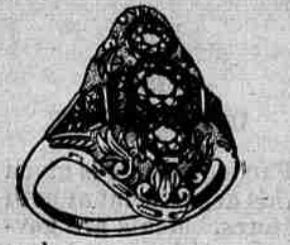
