CURTAILED EGG SALES RESULT OF HIGH PRICE

Variety still rules the Salem markets, with some commodities becoming scarce and others just coming in to replace them, while still others are just reaching the height of the season.

Eggs are causing no little concern among some of the merchants this week, but the food buyer is not so much, for he is, to a large extent, ignoring them. Retail egg sales here during the past few weeks, dealers estimate, have fallen to about 33 percent of normal, and Salem, normally a heavy producer for home consumption, has been forced to ship in from Portland considerable quantities for consumption here.

Importation of outside products, at higher prices, therefore, has resulted in somewhat of indifference on the part of the consumer. First quality eggs are selling generally at 45 cents per dozen, and butter, too, is higher, selling at from 58 to 60 cents a pound.

Among the late berries, huckleberries are a little higher, retailing at around 20 cents a pound, cranberries are steady at 30 cents. Everbearing strawberries are 15 cents a box, while fresh raspberries are 20 cents a box. Some evergreen blackberries are still obtainable. Increased shipments of cranberries during the coming week, together with a possible decrease in price is forecast by some merchants.

Elberta peaches and groundcherries are about a thing of the past, and soon watermelons and muskmelons will soon be gone. A few cantaloupes have reappeared but the season will be brief.

Bartlett pears are plentiful at varying prices depending upon quality, which is mostly good. Some stores are not stocking these extensively, but report that some of the canneries are selling "seconds" at around 50 cents a bushel, the quality of which is said to be fairly good for home canning.

Book pears have appeared for table use. Tomatoes, many of which are being taken for home canning, are selling at around \$1.25 a bushel. Grapes are very plentiful just now, with the juice and jelly varieties selling at from 5 to 8 cents a pound and the choicer table kinds somewhat higher.

Fresh Gravenstein apples are about cleaned up and are being or soon will be replaced by the first shipments of Jonathans from Yakima.

Red and green peppers will remain plentiful until the frosts shut off the supply, while pickling cucumbers are being sold generally at 7 1/2 cents per pound.

Green beans are still in the market in fair supply, ranging in price from 8 pounds for 25 cents for somewhat stale product to 3 pounds for 25 cents for fresher, tenderer stuff.

Local lettuce is in plentiful supply, generally at 10 cents a head.

WOMEN END SURVEY KITCHEN UTILITIES

Washington, (P)—Colorado's urban homes are ranked higher than the average throughout the country with respect to the number equipped with kitchen sinks and running water in a survey conducted by the General Federation of Women's clubs.

In Colorado towns of 10,000 to 25,000 population, 90 in every 100 dwellings were found to have this housekeeping accessory.

The state, however, was not ranked so high in the number of homes having electricity. Only three-fourths of the Colorado urban homes are electrically lighted while the national average in urban homes is four-fifths.

A larger proportion of California farm homes use electricity for cooking than do those in any other state.

Try This Tested Recipe for Overnight Cookies: 1 cup sugar, 1/4 cup salted Wild Rose Lard, 4 1/2 cups flour, 1/2 cup milk, 1 teaspoon salt, 2 level teaspoons baking powder.

Mix lard and sugar, add whole eggs, one at a time alternately with flour, salt and baking powder, sifted together. To make four kinds from one dough: Add to one part 1/4 cup macaroon coconut, to another 1/4 cup sliced stoned dates, to another 1/2 teaspoon each cinnamon and nutmeg and to the last 1/4 cup peanut butter or coarsely chopped walnuts. Pack separately or in layers in loaf tin, lined with oil or parchment paper and let stand overnight in cold place. To bake slice very thin with sharp knife and bake 7 to 10 minutes in hot oven.

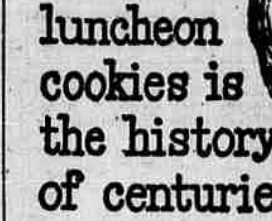
