"Young people will vote right when they get right," Dr. Landreth declared, speaking from a text "Whatever He sayeth unto you do it." The church of Jesus Christ cannot afford to play partisan politics for any candidate who stands for anything opposing any one of the Ten Commandments.

"God calls people, I believe," continued Dr. Landreth, "to be merchants, doctors, ministers, real estate dealers—He calls men to all necessary and honorable work, but young men, be sure that you hear the call."

Dr. Landreth expressed the belief that many ministers are making "a mess of law and a great many lawyers making a mess of preaching."

The meeting here was the last of a series Dr. Landreth has conducted during a five day tour of the state.

TEXACO HOLDS OLD PRICE FOR GASOLINE HERE

Portland (7)—Three service stations exhibited price signs Thursday calculated to line motorists up at their pumps. The price was 16 1/2 cents. All about them were signs listing gasoline at 22 1/2 cents, the "standard" price set by the Portland Retail Gasoline Dealers' Protective association.

The three non-conformist stations are owned by the Texas company and leased to operators. "Texaco's decision to fall from the oil company ranks when the wholesale price was jumped, makes it possible for these operators to make the regular six-cent margin."

Officials of Texaco here said the company was not trying to hold its dealers to the lower price level. The company was interested, they said, only in tank wagon sales.

Texaco dealers in Salem were the only gasoline sellers that had not raised retail prices to 25 cents a gallon Thursday. The Texaco stations are still selling for 18 cents.

Members of the state board of control said Wednesday, after a conference with W. C. Knighton, Portland architect, that actual construction of the new state office building will probably start early in May. The exterior plans for the building were approved and the architect was instructed to complete the details so that the board may call for bids.

Bids for the excavation will probably be advertised for, it was said, within the next three weeks and for the general construction in about six weeks.
