

DEVELOPMENT OF MULTIPLEX RADIO IS NEXT

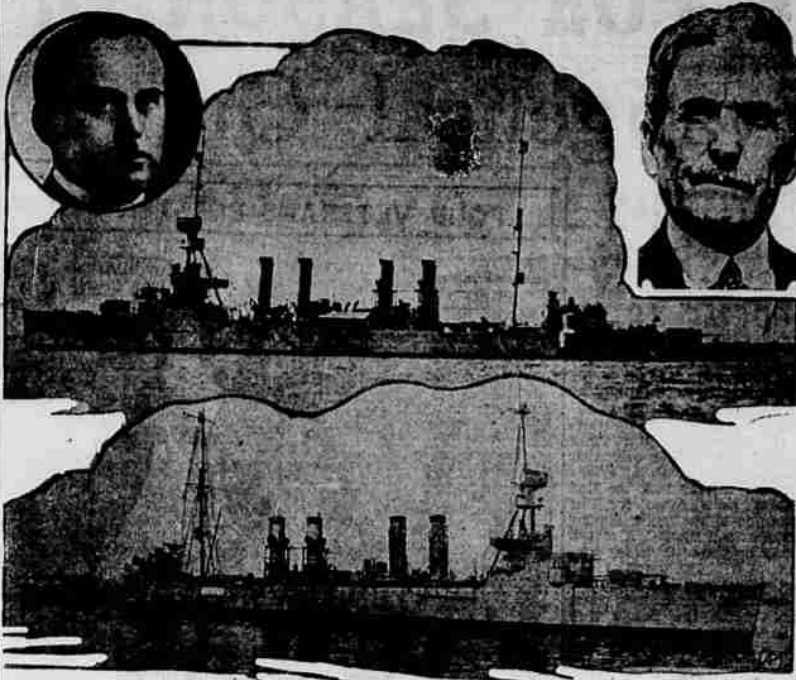
Boston. (P)—Development of a new communications system, designed to make possible the transmission of hundreds of different messages simultaneously on one radio waveband, is announced by Albert B. Clark, Boston.

Applications for patent rights on this device and for a patent on a synchronizing device employed, which also is applicable to television, have been made by Mr. Clark. "The best principles in radio practice are made use of and the invention may be used with modifications in connection with existing radio apparatus arranged for code, radio, phone or broadcast transmission," Mr. Clark says.

"The results are made possible by the employment of timed or synchronous apparatus capable of acting at great speed. This arrangement is made to serve the double purpose of consecutively breaking up a large number of individual signals into components, and of properly aggregating these components when they are built up by special electrical persistence devices into strong signals of the original characters, and then employed to actuate any desired instruments such as typewriters, printers, etc."
