Blair, who was at the wheel, fell asleep for an instant and the car veered off the highway into the McKee yard, breaking off three valuable walnut trees, wrecked a grapevine and trellis, broke off several shrubs and narrowly missed two telephone poles. Considerable shrubbery in the Lynes yard next door was also broken down.

They drove on down the highway for several miles before fully realizing the extent of the wreckage left behind and returned of their own accord and paid all damages.
