

GATES PEOPLE ESCAPE INJURY IN CAR CRASHES

Gates—Two of the citizens of the Gates vicinity figured in automobile accidents last Saturday, which did considerable damage to their cars, but little to the occupants. George McCurdy of Niagara, was driving to his home when the west bound stage coming at an excessive rate of speed for such narrow roads and dangerous curves as obtain on the Niagara road, hit Mr. McCurdy's sedan, tearing off a wheel and axle and damaging the car beyond repair. The accident happened near the Millan place and the crash could be heard for some distance. No one was hurt.

The truck was so damaged that Mr. Houghton hired another truck to deliver his hay.
