"We must have seen in recent years federal judges who were appointed in most cases through the mighty influence of wealth to positions of unlimited power, for life, issuing injunctions in labor disputes, which, in effect, bring about involuntary servitude." he said.

Declaring the "ordinary citizen had nothing to say as to who shall be precident" and that "there is no such thing as electing an independent candidate for president," he proposed the abolition of the electoral college and "giving to the electoral college and "giving to the electors the freedom of the ballot."

"The power and influence of monopoly in the control of our political and economic system," he continued, "had been recently very effectively shown by the investigation made by the federal trade commission of the activities of the so-called power trust. The evidence produced demonstrates that the power trust is the greatest monopoly which has ever been put together by human ingenuity."

Explaining his proposal for a progressive inheritance tax, he suggested that it contain liberal exemptions to provide for the comfort "and even the luxury of those dependent upon the testator during his life," He urged that the rate be combination and monopoly beyond his natural life."
