Vatican City (AP)—Friction between the Holy See and the Fascist government over the status of members of Catholic lay organizations, and the government's attitude toward them, is understood to have been the main topic discussed during a two-hour audience which Pope Pius accorded Thursday to Count De Vecchi, Italian ambassador to the Vatican.
