Prominent Women To Assist "Y"

Announcement that the campaign drive for the annual Y. W. C. A. drive for budget funds would be held from March 31 to April 6 has brought a number of prominent society and club women into a common bond of service for the younger girls of the community and for the indigent woman.

Mrs. Rex Sanford, general chairman for the drive, has as her major assistants as chairmen of different divisions, Mrs. W. D. Clarke, Mrs. J. A. Brownson, Mrs. F. A. Elliott, Mrs. Prince Byrd, Mrs. P. A. Erickson, Mrs. Eric Butler, Mrs. William McGilchrist, Jr., and Mrs. B. C. Miles. In addition to the women named, committee members, active campaign members and assistants will number more than 200 prominent local women.

The budget for the coming year totals \$9,000, including \$1,000 for the year's expenses and \$8,000 to take care of the change in the fiscal year from February 1 to April 1. Strenuous efforts will be made to secure the entire budget during the intensive campaign week.

The Salem Y. W. C. A. has made fine progress in their program this last year, and has reached the stage where with but little additional expense the projects can be enlarged. Should a financial setback occur, the outstanding developments during the past year would suffer severely. This is especially true of the work done in the Girls Reserves organization and in the industrial and business girls groups.

Girls Reserves units have been organized in every school in the city, in the junior and senior high schools at Silverton and in several rural districts. The work accomplished in directing and encouraging the young girl of school age has been one of the great projects not only of the local Y. W. C. A. but of the national association.

Equally important is the work done with the younger business and industrial girls. In Salem two clubs, the Encinitis club for the business girls, and the Les Amies club for the industrial girls, have proven exceedingly popular with the young people they have been created to serve. At present the Encinitis club has grown so large that the limited accommodations of the Y. W. C. A. rooms will not serve the entire membership, and plans are being made to divide the group into two divisions. If the budget is carried through without curtailment, a second group of the LesAmies club will also be organized.

While the work with the younger girls is one of the most popular and outstanding qualities of the local Y. W. C. A., numerous other duties are relegated to the staff. Applications for positions, made by indigent and needy women, have been filled with an average of 75 per cent. Travelers, and those ill or in distress always find the Y. W. C. A. a refuge.
