WATER COMPANY The Oregon-Washington Water Service Company is entering an extensive program for the construction of a modern filtering system and necessary adjuncts and extensions thereto which will cost a large sum of money. We believe the water company in contact with the best engineering service available, and in our opinion, is in a much better position to install a plant of this type than the City of Salem. It is, therefore, the belief of your advisory committee that the water company should be permitted to proceed with this work to its conclusion, so if any mistakes should be made in the construction of this filtering system, the loss due to experimenting will fall on the water company and not on the City of Salem. Moreover, there is considerable unemployment in the city and the work undertaken will greatly relieve the labor situation.

At this time the municipal bond market is unfavorable and financial conditions surrounding securities are more or less unsettled and it will probably be at least a year before normal conditions may be expected. It is the opinion of your advisory committee that the water company has entered into its present undertaking in good faith, and has already expended several thousands of dollars preparing for the installation of its proposed project, which we believe will greatly benefit both domestic and industrial users. We, therefore, believe the people of the City of Salem should support the plan in operation and judge the services rendered and rates charged whether or not the city should purchase the plant, and we further feel that a period of at least one year is necessary to accomplish this purpose.
