

### IDAHO WETS SPURN ADVICE OF GOVERNOR

Wallace, Idaho (AP)—Declaring that "we do not need the paternal advice of our governor in doing a proper and legal act in conformity with the best traditions of the republic," state senator, Donald A. Callahan, president of the recently formed Idaho association for repeal of the 18th amendment, Friday answered Governor Baldrige's attack against his anti-prohibition campaign.

Governor H. C. Baldrige of Idaho had assailed "anti-prohibition campaigns that fail to offer any substitute to prevent the return of saloon days" and said that unless Callahan "is able to suggest something better than the present prohibition enforcement," he is "doing himself an injustice."

The voters of Shoshone county have formed a perfectly legal and orderly association to work for the repeal of the 18th amendment, Senator Callahan's message said. "They are following the course used by the prohibition forces in securing adoption of an amendment for the purpose of promoting temperance and securing compliance with the law, which fits the public conscience, removing a source of corruption and profligacy youth."

"When the 18th amendment has been removed the American people will be free to enact such legislation as will remedy present conditions and bring about respect for law. I am willing to trust to the judgment of the people, once they are free to act."

### UNION PACIFIC BUYS \$500,000 BUSES

Omaha, Neb., (AP)—The Union Pacific system announces the purchase of nearly a half million dollars worth of motor buses for its transcontinental and west coast routes.

Twenty-two of the new buses will be added to lines between Chicago and Los Angeles, and eleven between Portland, Spokane, Boise and Salt Lake City.

The Interstate Transit lines, Union Pacific Stages, Inc., and the Interstate Coach company, subsidiaries of the railroad system, have in operation 300 stages on transcontinental routes from Chicago and St. Louis to Los Angeles and Boise, Spokane and Portland in the northwest, and on feeder routes. The new equipment comprises 30 coaches of 34-passenger capacity, 120 of 26-passenger capacity, and one of 21. All equipment was ordered for immediate delivery, said J. L. Haight, vice president of the Union Pacific, who announced the purchase.

### ATHEISTS ARE TOLD TO EVADE DRASTIC ACTS

Moscow (AP)—Official warning to be moderate in carrying out the anti-religious campaign of the Soviet government and the communist party was the interpretation gained Friday from speeches before the opening of the all-union congress of atheists.

A succession of speakers told the congress that their propagandists must abandon the idea that religion can be exterminated in Russia overnight. They declared that excesses committed by atheistic workers and village officials in the war on religion must forthwith cease.

The conclave was warned that no attempt must be made to close churches by force, to remove church bells, to coerce peasants into joining the league of the Godless, or to proclaim entire districts as "atheistic regions."

Alternatives of peaceful argument, persuasion, propaganda, and scientific explanation were listed by Emeljan Yaroslavsky, chairman of the Society of Militant Atheists, who declared that propaganda particularly must be intensified, partly among women who, he said, were more ignorant and superstitious than men.

This moderation, however, did not prevent speakers striking back at Pope Pius for his recent denunciation of the anti-religious campaign, and for his mass and prayers Wednesday at St. Peter's. The "Godless One," official atheist organ, printed a drawing of the pontiff sitting placidly on a throne, while victim after victim of the religious inquisition was hanged and tortured before him. The caption: "Your Blood-stained Hands are Too Short to Strangle Soviet Workers." was carried over the picture, while in the accompanying columns it was said:

"Those who overthrow on earth the thrones of the czars, manufacturers and land owners, those who build a new life with their own hands, are in no need of a God or heavenly protection."

"Our leaders no longer wish for the chaining of bells, the light of holy candles, or the burning of incense. They want to build palaces of culture, to erect tall radio masts, and to cover their country with a long chain of universities."

### COUNCIL MOVE IS AWAITED BY NORTH SALEM

The Hollywood Community Improvement club voted, in a meeting at the Pat Boy Barbecue Thursday night, to withhold circulation of petitions to get the municipal water question before the people pending decisive action by the city council. Should the council fail to act favorably at the special meeting which probably will be called for next Monday night the Hollywood petitions will be put into circulation.

The Hollywood people declare they can get a sufficient number of signatures on them within a few hours.

Alderman O'Hara reports that he has enough signatures on his petition for a special meeting of the council to assure the meeting being called.

The Hollywood club's special committee on fire alarm system made a report Thursday night, again adverse to installation of the system, but no action was taken by the club. The proposal to get cluster lights installed in Hollywood's main thoroughfare is still alive, and P. M. Gregory, president of the club, appointed a special committee to investigate the question further and report at the next meeting, which will be held April 3 at the Hollywood cafe.

Martin F. Ferrey, one of the candidates for justice of the peace, addressed the meeting Thursday night.

### AGED CHINESE DIES LEAVING 109 HEIRS

Honolulu, T. H. (AP)—One hundred and nine living descendants paid final honors to the memory of Ching Yuen-foo, retired Chinese painter, who died at the age of 87 years.

Ching was survived by a widow, three sons, two daughters, 47 grandchildren and 87 great grandchildren. One descendant lives in China, two on the mainland of the United States, and the rest in Hawaii.
