

ANNUAL GEER REUNION HAS EARLY START

Waldo Hills—Again preparations are going forward for the annual Geer reunion. This year it will be held on the historic Champoux grounds and it will be dedicated to T. T. Geer, Oregon's first governor. The Geer reunions originated with Mr. Geer and has been continued in his memory. Usually the affair is held at the home of A. A. Geer in the Waldo Hills. This was also the old home of Homer Davenport, whose mother was a Geer. A. A. Geer, who now owns the place, is president of the organization. This year's meeting date has been set for June 22. It is expected that some 200 will attend.

Perhaps most important of the Geers who are expected to be present at the reunion is Calvin Geer, or "Uncle Cal" as he is known at Silverton. Geer spends his winters with his daughter, Mrs. Ida G. Clymer, at Yuma, Ariz., and so far has been able to come to Oregon for the summers. He is thought to be the only living member of the emigrant train first to cross the Barlow road in the early part of 1847. He is now 63 years of age and while he is still enjoying good health he is not as strong as he used to be and it is thought that likely this will be his last summer trip to Oregon.

BUTLER FUNERAL TO BE HELD THURSDAY

Jefferson—Funeral services will be held Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Fortmiller funeral home in Albany for Deles T. Butler, 58, who died suddenly of heart trouble at his home in the Syracuse district, six miles west of Jefferson Friday.

Butler was born at Albany, Missouri in 1872, spending his boyhood days in that state. He lived for a number of years in Kansas and Idaho before coming to Oregon in 1906. He first located near Millersburg and later bought a farm near Dever, where he spent the last years of his life.

Surviving him are his widow and a son, Rexford N. Butler, five brothers and one sister. He was a member of the Christian church. Interment will be made in the Riverside cemetery at Albany.
