

### TORONTO READY FOR CONCLAVE OF SHRINE HOST

Toronto, Ont. (AP)—All arrangements are complete for establishment of two great wheel cities within the city of Toronto, which will house approximately 20,000 members of the Ancient Order of Nobles of the Mystic Shrine during their annual conclave here early in June.

With 300,000 Shriners to be added temporarily to Toronto's population of 750,000, the Canadian National and the Canadian Pacific have been called upon to provide their annual conclave here early in June.

The larger Shrine Temples which will come by special train will be housed in the same Pullman cars in which they arrive, in great coach yards which have been set aside for them.

The Canadian National has assigned its regular coach yards, midway between the downtown section of the city and the Canadian National Exhibition grounds, for parking of its special Shrine trains. The 31 tracks will hold more than 350 Pullmans, accommodating about 12,000 Shriners.

"Temple Park," as the Canadian National's wheeled city will be known, will have its own administration offices, barber shops, beauty parlors, post office, telegraph offices, telephones, restaurant, moving picture theater, rest rooms, shoe shine parlors and magazines and tobacco stands. All these activities will be housed in a two-story brick building at one end of the tracks.

Broad concrete platforms stretch the length of the tracks on which the Shriners' Pullmans will be parked. Each platform is an avenue, designated by a letter of the alphabet so that the city's temporary residents may find their way "home" easily.

Taxicabs can be driven to the end of each avenue so that the convention-weary delegates need walk only a few steps to their cars.

### MYSTERY PLANE TO ASCEND VERTICALLY

Farnborough, England (AP)—A new mystery airplane, which seeks to solve the problem of vertical flight, is to be tested soon at the Air Ministry's experimental station here.

The machine, which has been built with great secrecy for the ministry at Cowes, is called a helicopter. It has an ordinary airplane body with an engine on the nose for forward drive.

Mounted above the body are four movable wings which are rotated by small propellers run by engines on the front edges of the wings. It is hoped that the rotating wings will lift the machine vertically and enable it to remain stationary in mid-air.

### CENSUS GIVES SALEM 26,068

Additional residents enumerated in Salem brings the total population to date 26,068, according to R. J. Hendricks, census supervisor for this district. Hendricks is urging all who have not been enumerated to telephone 686 or the postoffice building and be listed. The books will be opened to all who have not been enumerated until the last book is sent to Washington, states the supervisor. Local people are anxious to have at least 25,190 names

enumerated in order that if duplications are found the census for Salem will still remain more than 26,000. The first box of enumerator's portfolios were sent on their way to Washington, D. C. Tuesday afternoon. The box contained 68 portfolios and weighed between 200 and 300 pounds. The total weight of census portfolios which will be returned to Washington will be somewhere over a ton, estimates Hendricks.
