The liberal supply of fresh salmon has tapered off to the extent that an acute shortage follows the overplus in the trade.

There remains a very sluggish tone in the onion market. Prices are weak.

KURDS DEMAND RECOGNITION OF RULER OF IRAK

Suleimaniya, Iraq (AP)—"King of Kurdistan" will be added to the title of Feisal, King of Iraq, if the desire of the Iraqi Kurds is carried out.

The Kurds have long desired the national movement of the Kurds of Mesopotamia, with Suleimaniya as its center.

The Kurds fear that the proposed treaty between Iraq and Great Britain, which contains no mention of the rights of the Kurds being guaranteed by the League of Nations, should render their fight for liberty still harder.
