**REPORTS PROGRESS ON TURNER LIBRARY**

Work which is under way on the new public library and memorial museum at the town of Turner is expected to be finished about April 1, according to S. M. Endicot, local attorney, who has charge of the work for Mrs. Corneilia Davis who is donating the funds for erection of the structure. Endicot states that the concrete for the basement has been poured and as soon as this sets, work will continue. The building will have a full basement and will be one story high of reinforced concrete covered by stucco.

The main part of the upper floor will be for a public library. One end of the building will be used as a memorial museum dedicated to the memory of Lewis H. Turner. There will be housed many of the belongings of the Turner family which were turned over to the Eugene Bible university but to be returned to Turner when the building is occupied. It is expected the museum will be kept up from year to year to remain as a continuing history of Turner and the family.

The library building will be 70x30 and Endicot states that the main library room will be about as large as the one at the Salem library. The building will cost between \$15,000 and \$20,000.
