Play Attracts Interest

Salem social circles as well as "little theater" enthusiasts are evincing much interest in the presentation of the Shakespearean drama, "Cymbeline," to be given Thursday evening at the Capitol theater. The social prominence of many members of the cast and the interesting display of amateur talent, is rivaling the attraction of period costumes and the creation of a replica of the stage in the old Globe theater of Shakespeare's day, which has been designed by the local people especially for this play.

But two professionals are taking part in the production of "Cymbeline." James Beard of Portland and Seattle has been directing the work on the play and will play the title role of Cymbeline. The British king, Ted Osburn, who has appeared in professional roles in the east and has just completed an engagement with the Duffy players of Portland, is cast as Posthumus Leonatus, the male lead.

Mr. Osburn arrived in Salem Sunday from Portland, and has since spent long hours in rehearsing with the cast and memorizing his lines. In an informal interview Tuesday afternoon, Mr. Osburn complimented the local actors on their enthusiasm and ambitious choice of a play, characterizing Shakespeare as the most difficult to produce satisfactorily, but one in which the results are bound to be interesting. He paid tribute to Miss Genevieve Thayer, who is playing the feminine lead as Imogene, for her work and said that her voice was of ideal quality for the part.

The professional actor was gratified with the costumes being completed to replace those lost through fire, and said that the entire cast was one of the most enjoyable amateur groups he had ever worked with.
