COURTS SIGN ROAD RIGHTS

Albany—Members of Linn county court and J. C. Stegmann, Mason county judge, and B. B. Herick, county surveyor of that county, signed an agreement Thursday providing for acquiring the right of way for the North Santiam highway in Linn county.

Under the agreement Linn county will do the work of acquiring the title to the land, which will turn over to Mason county. Mason county will pay for all the land conveyed and for the expense of negotiating for it.
