

REFEREES NAMED FOR HOOP GAMES MARION COUNTY

Assignment of officials for the 40 Marion county basketball league games has been completed. The lists covering the entire series during the remainder of January, February and March, prepared in the office of Fred Wolf, Salem high school principal, were placed in the mails Tuesday afternoon.

This is the first year a concerted effort has been made to secure capable officials for basketball games. Early in the season the physical education department of Willamette university agreed to conduct an official school. Fifteen or 18 men were incorporated in the school and besides being taught the rules of the game, were placed on the floor to demonstrate their ability during contests.

Criticism of each other's work by officials, which has been the custom for several years, will not be tolerated, it is said. Complaints of the work done of referees will be received by the head of the Marion county association but the team of any coach who publicly condemns the referee will be eliminated from further competition.

PHELAN TAKES SALARY SLASH

Seattle, Jan. 13 (AP)—A 20 percent reduction in the salary of Jimmy Phelan, football coach of the University of Washington, bringing it down to a basis of \$12,000 a year, today led a retrenchment move in the institution's athletic activities. The acceptance of the 20 percent cut, affecting all major coaches, their assistants and all other employees of the associated students of the university, was forthcoming after a four-hour session of the finance committee last night.

The reductions will be effective for the remainder of the fiscal year, which ends in August. In addition, a recommendation was formulated calling for the immediate dismissal of Steve Anderson, assistant track coach and former world champion hurdler.

dominated the game completely in the final period scoring eight points to the seniors' two. The league standings are as follows:

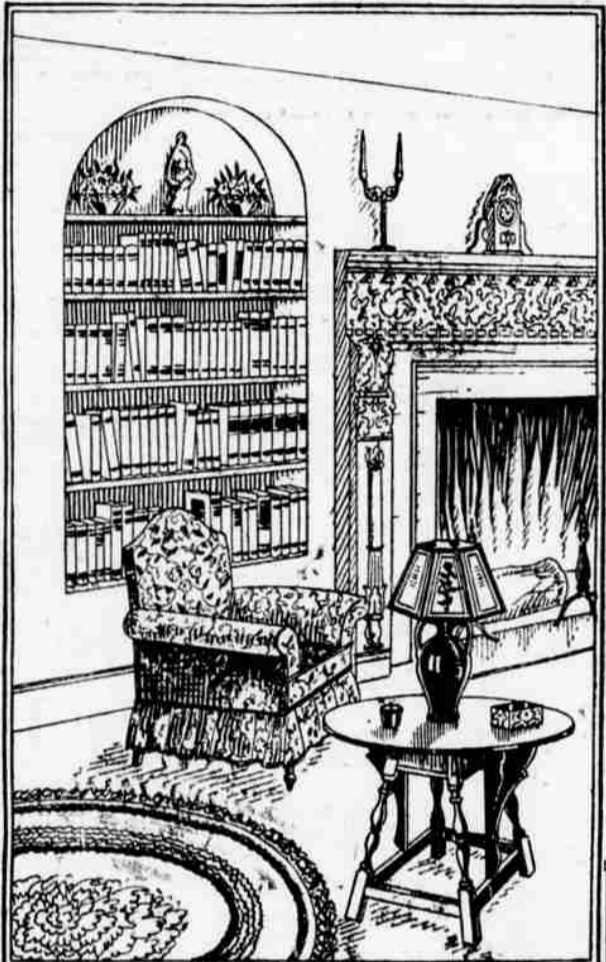
