

PETITION FOR DOCK FUND IS BEING DRAFTED

Tentative draft of an application to be filed with the federal Reconstruction Finance corporation by the Salem Dock & Terminal company for a loan to be used in the construction of a municipal dock for the city of Salem is being prepared and will be forwarded to Washington at the earliest date. Prior to preparation of the final draft more definite figures will be reached relative to cost, which is expected to range between \$5,000 and \$100,000.

The incorporators of the dock and terminal company are W. M. Hamilton, W. P. Ellis and J. N. Chambers.

Ellis said today that the property between Water street and the river, and bounded on its north and south ends by Chemeketa and Court streets, apparently is sufficiently large to enable the project to go ahead, though it may be necessary for the city to vacate Water street so part of it may be used. This appears to

be necessary, for the reason that the proposed warehouse and dock would be approximately 300 feet long and 100 feet wide, and the property alone without part of the street being used would not give that space.

A survey made by City Engineer Hugh Rogers shows that at the Court street end the property line is 18 feet from the street edge to the river bank and 70 feet to the water's edge, a total of 88 feet. On the Chemeketa street end it is four feet to the bank and 55 feet to the water, a total of 59 feet.

The dock would necessarily extend out over the water some distance, but it is said that driving of piles far out in the river at this location would offer engineering difficulties, for the reason that the river bed takes a precipitous drop under the water, and at one place is as much as 45 feet deep. Also the formation is a cement gravel in which the driving of piles is practically impossible.

Difficulties known to exist, however, are not considered serious enough to block the project.

As soon as the project is completed and contract executed with the Salem Navigation company, the property is to be deeded back to the city.

BIG TURNOUT AT P.-T. SESSION

Democratic Reward For Republican Help Proposed by Leaders

Washington, Oct. 21 (U.P.)—Practical politicians are listing with incredulous amazement to campaign gossip hinting the senate democrats might permit certain progressive republican senators to retain committee chairmanships in the next congress in the event of a democratic majority.

Practical politicians do not believe such reports. They feel it would be too much to ask a veteran democratic senator, Ashurst of Arizona, for instance, to forego the important judiciary chairmanship so Senator Norris, republican, Nebraska, could continue in that post. As senior democratic member, Ashurst normally would succeed to the chairmanship if democrats organized the senate.

But the debt of Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt to progressive republican senators will be considerable if he is elected president. Norris was the first and most emphatic of the progressive republican bolsters. He is on the stump now urging the electorate to vote for Roosevelt.

Senator Cutting, republican, New Mexico, and Senator LaFollette, republican, Wisconsin, have announced publicly they will support the New York governor. Senator Johnson, republican, California, has gone part way. He refused to support President Hoover and has not actively discouraged the belief that his own ballot will be for Roosevelt November 8. Chairman Borah of the senate foreign relations committee refuses to assist his party nominee.

With the exception of Cutting, these senators are chairmen of important committees. Johnson heads

the commerce committee and LaFollette the committee on manufactures.

Chairman Frazier of the Indian affairs committee, a North Dakota progressive, is another who refuses to ratify the republican national convention selection at Chicago.

Others of the progressive group up for re-election this year included Senator Norbeck, republican, South Dakota, and Senator Nye, republican, North Dakota, reports to Washington do not indicate either has broken with the administration.

Norbeck is chairman of the banking and currency committee and Nye of the public lands and surveys.

These progressives occupy coveted committee places over the protest of a considerable group of their stand-pat colleagues. The regulars sought several years ago to read out of the party the western dissident bloc. They would have refused them the rights of seniority and in some instances committee assignment. That move failed.
