House Defeats Bills To Curb Loan Sharks Pilotage Bill Loses Out
 While the senate cleared its calendar early yesterday, house was under special order for unemployment relief, there was no definite assurance any large amount could be definitely counted upon from the reconstruction finance corporation.
 Under the other relief legislation the issuance of automobile licenses up to July 1 this year for \$2.50, Secretary of State Hal E. Ross announced new licenses were being sold at the rate of 1,000 per day. The bill was signed by the governor 10 days ago and last night the total licenses issued under the new order totaled about 10,000.
 Oregon and Washington are the only two states in the union which do not make pilotage compulsory, Representative Judd of Clatsop county declared in opposition to the proposed pilot commission bill which came before the house in great recommendation of the committee. Proponents are attempting to cool the members of the house when they compare conditions at the mouth of the Columbia river with those at San Francisco, with 124 miles of river faced at the former against 10 miles of bay at the latter, he charged.
 The bill, which sought to create a state commission of five members, two from Multnomah, one each from Clatsop and Coos county and the fifth at large, representing the port and shipping interests, two of which were to be licensed pilots and the others familiar with conditions, was defeated 40 to 19.
 Net incomes of pilots have been around \$7500 a year, it was brought out. Producers and shippers in general are in favor of the bill, Representative Estes Eneador of Multnomah declared in presenting the matter. At present only pilots are members of the commission but under terms of the new bill shippers would be represented.
 Bar pilots at the mouth of the Columbia river have never lost a ship and the bar, much as he hated to admit it, is one of the "toughest" in the country, Representative Judd said. These pilots take large ships over a treacherous three-mile sand bar and then turn the ships over to river pilots for the rest of the trip.
 Protection of the interests of the people of Oregon and not the matter of pilotage fees is the prime motive of this bill, declared Representative Lonergan. There is more involved than a fight between pilots and steamship companies, he said.
 Bar pilots at the mouth of the Columbia river have never lost a ship and the bar, much as he hated to admit it, is one of the "toughest" in the country, Representative Judd said. These pilots take large ships over a treacherous three-mile sand bar and then turn the ships over to river pilots for the rest of the trip.
 Protection of the interests of the people of Oregon and not the matter of pilotage fees is the prime motive of this bill, declared Representative Lonergan. There is more involved than a fight between pilots and steamship companies, he said.

 Congress, which first thought it had dismissed the problem by voting in favor of the bill, was brought back to the subject by the action of congress in the past, found itself still in possession of a difficulty.
 Constitutional authorities were split as to whether the state legislatures or congress should provide for setting up the convention machinery.
 Such dissenters of constitutional law as Representative Beck, a Pennsylvania republican, and former solicitor general, and A. Mitchell Palmer, former democratic attorney general, took opposing views, with the latter insisting that the power belonged to congress.
 Representatives LaGuardia, New York republican, and Chairman Sumner of the judiciary committee promptly introduced bills to provide for the conventions.
 With the expressed opposition, however, of Speaker Garner and other leaders, who believed with Beck that the state legislatures should have a chance to act, little hope was voiced for enactment of these measures.
 In many of the legislative and executive chambers over the country sentiment was being built up against this dispute and movements were forward to set up the conventions.
 Washington, Feb. 21 (P)—Fifteen states, spurred on by a desire to be first, today definitely had set out on the road toward repeal of the prohibition amendment. A united front by congress put the question before them.
 Franklin D. Roosevelt gave his encouragement within a few moments after the house had spoken with a fifteen vote margin to let the people decide whether prohibition should prevail as the law of the land after 13 years of trial and controversy.
 But with his expressed gratification at the action of the house in concurring with the senate, the president-elect interpolated a further hope that the present congress in its dying days would fulfill another democratic platform pledge by legalizing beer.
 Forty-two legislatures are now meeting and two more, California and Florida, convene in the spring. Only four—Louisiana, Mississippi, Virginia and Kentucky—will not meet for a year or more.
 There was every indication, however, that ratification by the necessary 36 states within seven years would not come without furious resistance from dry organizations. The lower court is affirmed, that is the echo of the 289 to 121 vote in the house with a call to rally and "fight to the finish" in the states.
 Wyoming was away out ahead, for its legislature has already passed and the governor has signed a bill to provide for the constitutional convention.
 Other states in which action was begun in some quarter yesterday are Massachusetts, New York, Ohio, New Jersey, Wisconsin, Georgia, West Virginia, Arizona, Missouri, Delaware, California, Michigan, Iowa and Pennsylvania.
 First of the dry law supporters to predict "a fight to the finish" was Edward B. Dunford, general counsel for the anti-saloon league, who said it would be carried on in the election of delegates and, if necessary, in legal proceedings.
 Another thought was advanced by Mrs. Henry W. Peabody, general chairman of the woman's national committee for law enforcement, who asserted that the repeal resolution had brought the birth "of a new party."
 The committee immediately issued an invitation to "representatives from the states already organized for political action and those who wish to join, to confer in April on a movement looking toward a national coalition party ready for action in 1934."
