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## CUBE BUTTER UP ONE CENT AT WEEK-END

Portland, May 13 (AP)—Week-end advance of 1 cent pound in the price on cube butter on the Portland produce exchange was in line with action some time ago when the price was reduced. Then there was a most acute shortage of supplies with demand greater than offerings. Now there is a gradual accumulation of offerings and the price has been liberalized during the last few days, while demand is easily taken care of.

Butterfat values are inclined to be mixed again with the basis price Portland delivery 23 cents but 24 cents being paid in some instances.

Trade in the egg market continues of generally steady character here and along the coast. In spots the market is firmer. There is much less complaint regarding quality.

Generally mentioned prices continue in the live chicken market with practically no changes for the week-end. All sorts except small broilers are in greater call than supply.

There never was a greater call for country killed beef than during the last few days along the wholesale way. Prices are therefore firm. Veal, however, are just about holding at last declines. Hogs and lambs in call.

Further increased offerings of fresh salmon from the Columbia create additional weakness in the market. Reports suggest that fishermen are taking somewhat less for salmon than they have been offered by packers.

Competition is being fully met by nearby asparagus growers who say they are determined to stop the practice of some brokers in bringing California supplies just when the home product is getting into active movement. Most sales around \$1.75 pyramid.

### OCEAN TRAFFIC HAS INCREASE

San Francisco, May 13 (AP)—Trans-Pacific and inter-coastal shipping, an accurate gauge to business conditions, provided definite indications of a boom in business on the Pacific coast.

For the first time in three years, major steamship companies are anticipating increased tonnage. Two reasons are advanced. One is the upward trend in commodity prices. The other is the expected increase in the use of silver for monetary purposes.

We expect an increased freight business between the United States and China," said an official of the Nippon Yusen Kaisha line told the United Press. "The increased value of silver will enhance China's purchasing power and that country is a willing buyer whenever it has the means."

P. A. Bailey, vice-president of the Matson Steamship company, said that foreign commerce was up and that his line was prepared to place additional steamers into trans-Pacific service.
