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AVIATOR LEAVES RACING PLANE TO HIS WIDOW

Richmond, Va., June 6 (AP)—A powerful racing plane—without a pilot—awaits entrance in the July trans-continental race from Newark to Los Angeles.

Larry Jamieson, Richmond-New York air mail pilot, crashed to his death in a crash landing Sunday. He left to his family a bullet-like speed plane built for the climax of his career in the air—the trans-continental races.

Mrs. Caroline Jamieson, his widow, the mother of two little children, holds a transport license but she doesn't want to fly the ship she watched grow from her husband's dream.

She is looking for a racing pilot with whom to stake its success. She offers to share any prize money, her part to be used in the care of her family.

Larry designed the craft. Its construction was started in 1931. Its high compression Curtis D-12 engine with 12 cylinders has been developed from its original 450 horsepower to 600. Its landing gear is retractable. Byrd airport engineers say the plane is capable of more than 240 miles an hour.

Twelve hours before his death—with the throttle not wide open—Larry guided 300 miles an hour and swooped down to the port at 110 miles an hour, startling spectators.

It was the plane's fifth test flight. Until his death the plane was kept as a secret save to Larry's closest friends, and those who helped him in its construction.

pletely worked out, Young stated it will be a moderate priced theater with probability of a more modest price than that of any theater now operating here.

The interior of the building will be completely remodelled. The concrete floor will be removed and replaced by a sloping theater floor. A new front will be put in with a marquis, and plans are to include at one side of the entrance room for a small shop to cater to theater patrons and others.

The new house will not be an elaborate affair in any way, said Young. "It will be a comfortable, well ventilated and well heated house. These features will be concentrated on along with the idea of giving a good show. The plan is to furnish first and subsequent run pictures of a type never available in Salem before. The company also plans on numerous amusement innovations for Salem. A small stage will be installed to handle acts if necessary. The company which will handle the theater promises many new pictures which have never been available in this city and it is on the show and comfort of the house it plans to put in its best efforts, with no idea of any elaborate furnishings. In addition there will be installed a number of innovations in the shape of sound and picture projection which will add to the attractiveness of the house."

There is nothing personal about Cummings' opposition to the Donagh appointment. It is based wholly upon protests which have emanated from Oregon and centers on the criticism that Donagh lacks experience in line of duty.

For the same reason and for the sake of party harmony in the state organization Congressman Martin, who has been harassed with protests from Portland democrats, has refused to line up for Donagh.

The Oregon appointment for collector of internal revenue will naturally fall to J. W. Maloney of Pendleton, democratic candidate for state treasurer at the last election.

Delzell believes Maloney has the undivided endorsement of all of those in a position to influence the appointment and has no serious opposition.

Post office appointments, except the terms of incumbent republicans expire, are not even being considered in Washington, according to Delzell, and the policy will be to take them up as vacancies occur.

In only one instance has any state delegation been able to secure the replacement of republican postmasters in advance of the expiration of their terms—Oklahoma, which has a solid democratic delegation working as a unit.

Aide from patronage matters, where the republican members of the delegation are merely observers. The Oregon delegation is without exception doing everything possible to protect the state's interests. Delzell reports Senator Chas.
