

DUTCH COOKING RIVALS ANY ON THE CONTINENT

There's always been a great hula-hula raised about French cooking, German cooking, Italian cooking. You never hear much about Dutch cooking, but just talk to any traveler who has been to Holland, and you'll hear tales of food that will make you want to take the next boat.

One of the most charming things about the Dutch people is the ingenious way they concoct perfectly scrumptious dishes out of practically nothing at all. They can't afford meat very often and when they do have it, it is made into a sort of stew with potatoes, curly kale and other vegetables. Contrary to the general idea, the Dutch don't go in for dumplings... dumplings are a Danish dish. They do eat a great deal of cheese and butter—that's why the Dutch are always so plump and round and rosy. And when it comes to making pastry even the French chef will pin a blue ribbon on the Dutch cook.

Here is a typical Dutch pie called "Zeider Zee," with a crust made of Holland rusk, which you can buy in most grocery stores nowadays.

ZEIDER ZEE
Filling—
2 cups milk
2 egg yolks
1/2 tsp. cornstarch
1/4 cup sugar
Crust—
1 pkg. rusk
1/2 cup butter
1/4 cup sugar
1 tsp. cinnamon
2 egg whites
Beat the milk in top of double boiler. Blend beaten egg yolks, cornstarch, and 1/4 cup sugar, and stir into milk. Cook over hot water for 10 minutes and cool. To prepare crust, roll rusk fine and mix with butter, 1/4 cup sugar and the cinnamon. Press half of this mixture in an even layer against sides and bottom of buttered pie plate. Fill with custard. Spread the stiffly beaten egg whites on top of custard and sprinkle remaining rusk crumbs over egg whites. Bake in slow oven (350 degrees F.) for 15 minutes. Chill and serve. Makes one 8-inch pie.

BISCUITS (12)
2 cups pastry flour
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
4 tablespoons fat
2-3 cup milk
Mix flour, baking powder and salt. Cut in fat with knife. Mixing with knife, slowly add milk. When soft dough forms, pat out until 1/2 inch thick. Cut out biscuits, bake 12 minutes in moderate oven. Serve hot with butter.

CHEESE PASTRY PIE
1 1/2 cups flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 cup lard
1-2 cup grated cheese
2 tablespoons cold water
Mix flour and salt. Cut in lard with knife. Mixing with knife, add cheese and water. Mix lightly. When stiff dough forms, shape into ball and press together firmly. Roll out on floured board, fit into pie pan. Prick bottom and sides and bake 15 minutes in moderate oven. Add the lemon filling.

LEMON FILLING
1 cup sugar
8 tablespoons flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup lemon juice
