COLORADO TEAM IS SIXTH CLUB TOPEKA SERIES

Kansas City, Aug. 22 (AP)—The Louisville, Colo., Junior American Legion baseball team today lined up with five other teams which have qualified for the western sectional tournament at Topeka, Kas., August 24-26.

Meeting Nellig, Neb., the only other regional contender at the Grand Island, Neb., meet yesterday, the Coloradans won the deciding game of the series 9 to 7 and left immediately by motor car for Topeka.

Other teams which will seek the western sectional title and one of the final berths in the junior world series at New Orleans are Chicago, Stockton, Calif., Fargo, N.D., Woodburn, Ore., and Ada, Okla. The eastern sectional series at Springfield, Ohio, begins today.

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Yankees And White Sox Battle 18 Innings To Tie; Washington Idle

All but hopelessly outdistanced in the pennant race, the New York Yankees still hang on to their knack of setting up new records of one description or another. This time, though, it's only a new seasonal endurance mark for the American league which they established with the help of the Chicago White Sox yesterday in an 18 inning battle that wound up in a 3-3 tie and left the Yankees still eight and a half games behind the idle Washington Senators.

Darkness finally broke up a duel which the Yankees twice apparently had won—first in the 9th and then in the 11th.

In the 11th the Yanks scored twice on hits by Dixie Walker and Ben Chapman, a pass and an infield out but the Sox came back again to tie the score when Evar Swanson singled with the bases filled. After that it was a scoreless duel between two of the league's oldest twirlers—Pennock and Red Faber who relieved Gaston at the start of the 12th.

The 18-hole tussle equalled the season's major league high mark set up by the New York Giants and St. Louis Cardinals of the National league on July 2 and eclipsed the 17-inning game the White Sox played with Detroit's Tigers August 13.

Meanwhile the third place Cleveland Indians stretched their winning streak to seven games, downing the Boston Red Sox 10-1. Monte Pearson and Bob Weiland waged a tight duel for seven frames but in the eighth the Indians broke loose for seven hits, which with two passes and an error gave them eight runs. The victory increased Cleveland's lead over Detroit to two games but left the Indians still trailing the Yankees by 9 1/2 games.

Detroit's pitching staff collapsed in the other American league game of the day and the Tigers dropped a 12-7 decision to the Philadelphia Athletics. Three Tiger hurlers gave up 17 hits and walked ten men.

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SOLDIER FIELD GRID GAME TO ATTRACT CROWD

Chicago, Aug. 22 (AP)—The east-west football game began to take on the appearance of a real gridiron battle today instead of an exhibition game between two squads of poorly-conditioned players in town to see the world's fair. The game will be played under the floodlights at Soldier field Thursday night and promises to attract a crowd of 40,000 or more.

The race is run annually under the sponsorship of the Anchor club of Vancouver. This year was the first time in the history of the event that it was open to outside competition.
